Collect

O Lord who for our sake didst fast forty days and forty nights: give us grace to use such abstinence, that, our flesh being subdued to the Spirit, we may ever obey thy godly motions in righteousness and true holiness, to thy honour and glory; who livest and reignest with the Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. First Reading

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Moses said to the people, "The priest shall take the basket [of first fruits] from your hand, and set it down before the altar of the Lord your God. And you shall make response before the Lord your God, 'A wandering Aramean was my father; and he went down into Egypt and sojourned there, few in number; and there he became a nation, great, mighty, and populous. And the Egyptians treated us harshly, and afflicted us, and laid upon us hard bondage. Then we cried to the Lord the God of our fathers, and the Lord heard our voice, and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with great terror, with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. And behold, now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground, which thou, O Lord, hast given me.' And you shall set it down before the Lord your God, and worship before the Lord your God."

Romans 10:8-13

Brethren: What does the Scripture say? For man believes with his heart and so is justified, and he confesses with his lips and so is saved. The scripture says, "No one who believes in him will be put to shame." Mark Your Calendar – Totus Tuus is Coming

Totus Tuus, which is Latin for “totally yours,” is a nationally known Catholic Vacation Bible school program that will be coming to St. Mary the Virgin on July 13-20. The program is split into two offerings -- one for children during the day and another for youths during the evenings. Each day includes catechetical instruction, Mass, songs and games, which is led by a team of college-age missionaries.

Fr. Dean served as a spiritual advisor to Totus Tuus leadership teams in the past and is excited to be able to bring the program to the parish. Stay tuned for more details.

Lenten Quiet Day

Saturday, March 23 at St. Mary the Virgin

The Ordinariate Parishes of North Texas are having a quiet day of Adoration, Recollection and Benediction for everyone, young and old. It will begin with Mass at 9:00 AM (as usual). At the conclusion of Mass there will begin Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which will continue during the rest of the Quiet Day. Frs. Dean, Kennedy, Stainbrook and Fogel will each offer a brief recollection followed by a period of quiet adoration with the chance for meditation or prayer.

After two morning times of recollection and prayer there will be silent lunch of soup, salad and bread.

Following lunch there will be two more periods of recollection and prayer and the quiet day will end with Benediction. **We should end no later than 2:00 PM.**

This opportunity to put aside the busyness of life for a few, brief five hours and reflect on our relationship with our Lord as we prepare for the paschal feast is not to be thought of as the ubiquitous "penance service" though there will be the opportunity for confession in the confessional. Everyone is invited to participate in the whole of quiet day, not simply to rush in, confess and leave. This is your chance to adore our Lord on a day and in a time when you perhaps are not able to participate during the regular Friday adoration. Please observe the Eucharistic fast (one hour prior to Mass without food) prior to attending the Quiet Day's opening Mass.

St. Mary the Virgin will provide the soup. We invite others to generously provide the salad, dressings & breads.

Because Advent was so short this past December, we are now offering this time to spiritually remove ourselves from all the noise and distractions around us and focus on what is truly important in our lives and in our hearts.

We encourage everyone to set aside these few hours for our Lord on March 23rd.



To the Parishioners of St. Mary the Virgin,

“Remember, O man, that thou art dust, and wilt return to dust.” We have to be reminded of that; Almighty God does not have to be reminded of anything: “He remembers” says King David, “that we are dust.” He remembers, therefore, the frailty of our nature; and he knows that we shall be angry in spite of ourselves, even with our Lord’s own words ringing in our ears to prevent us. So he goes on to tell us the next best thing; if sudden irritation does get the better of us for a moment, and we say something we regret afterwards, we are to make it right as soon as possible. If you are offering your gift at the altar, and remember that your brother has some cause of offence against you, run back and be reconciled to him before you offer your gift. Do we remember that as often as we should, when we bring to the altar of the Christian sacrifice the poor gift of our unworthy devotion? We are careful to make our peace with God by confession; are we equally careful to make sure that we are at peace with our fellow men? That does not mean that we should always be going about apologizing to one another; a person who is always apologizing is very often a nuisance. But tell me, when you’ve “had words” with somebody, isn’t there usually a chance, before the next time you go to confession, of saying some kind word, doing some trifling service, which will obliterate the memory of your quarrel without the need of referring to it? That is what Jesus Christ wants you to do. “Agree with thy adversary quickly, whilst thou art in the way with him.”(Matt. 5:25) You start a quarrel; how do you know that death will not intervene before it can be put right? And that means purgatory: “thou shalt not go out from thence until thou hast paid the last mite.” (Luke 12:59) And our Lord does not want us to have any purgatory, he wants us to come straight to him. He wants us to be his children; and how can we be his children if we are not like our Father?
