

# To the Parishioners of St. Mary the Virgin

Sometimes the voice of the Lord comes to us in a whisper. Why a whisper? Why doesn't the Lord just shout out instructions that we may clearly hear and follow?

Just think of your posture when you are straining to hear something really important. You are very quiet and still and have focused all your attention to the sense of hearing. If there is noise or distractions, you are doing your best to filter it out. Your posture is often bent forward, your eyes closed to improve concentration. If we are straining to hear the Lord's whispers, then the very act of listening has removed some of the normal barriers to communications. We are not worrying about what is for dinner or planning our route to avoid road construction. We set aside the normal stuff that occupies us. Even our worries and cares for others have been momentarily sidelined.

That is the posture and concentration God wants and needs from us to communicate his will and for us to be able to surrender our own. Just imagine how you would give instructions to a child who has to cross a busy city street alone and catch a bus for the first time. You want them to be still and quiet and giving you regular signals that they hear you and understand what you are saying.

We should make quiet time with the Lord a part of every day. For those of you fortunate enough to be able to go to daily Mass during the week or on Saturday morning, the Mass itself provides the opportunity to be still and quiet before the Lord. Adoration is another wonderful opportunity to listen for God's whispers. We provide the Adoration from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. every Friday at St. Mary the Virgin. St. John Paul II wrote: "Only by deepening our Eucharistic communion with the Lord through personal prayer can we discover what he asks of us in daily life. Only

by drinking deeply from the source of life-giving water 'welling up within us' can we grow in faith, hope and charity. The image of the Church in worship before the Blessed Sacrament reminds us of the need to enter into a dialogue with our Redeemer, to respond to his love and to love one another."

May this prayer from Saint Thomas Aquinas, help lead you to seek and hear God's whispers:

## Prayer of St. Thomas Aquinas

"Almighty and ever-living God, I approach the sacrament of your only-begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. I come sick to the doctor of life, unclean to the fountain of mercy, blind to the radiance of eternal light, and poor and needy to the Lord of heaven and earth. Lord, in your great generosity, heal my sickness, wash away my defilement, enlighten my blindness, enrich my poverty, and clothe my nakedness.

"May I receive the bread of angels, the King of kings and Lord of lords, with humble reverence, with the purity and faith, the repentance and love, and the determined purpose that will help to bring me to salvation. May I receive the sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood, and its reality and power.

"Kind God, may I receive the Body of your only-begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, born from the womb of the Virgin Mary, and so be received into His mystical Body and numbered among his members. Loving Father, as on my earthly pilgrimage I now receive your beloved Son, under the veil of a sacrament, may I one day see Him Face to face in glory, who lives and reigns with You for ever. Amen."


