

To the Parishioners of St. Mary the Virgin

If you go to the 8:00 a.m. Mass or have a child in Christian education, you may have noticed a steady stream of women walking down the parking lot toward the church offices.

There are around 20 women of the parish who have signed up to participate in the ENDOW program for women that was started this past fall at St. Mary the Virgin.

ENDOW stands for Educating on the Nature and Dignity of Women. It was an initiative launched by three women in 2003 in the Diocese of Denver and supported by then Denver Archbishop Charles Chaput. The women started by publishing small-group study guides on Saint John Paul II's two seminal documents on the "feminine genius" so that women of all walks of life may understand the beauty and depth of the Church's teaching on women. From this beginning, the program grew to include other studies such as St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, Saint Thomas Aquinas and St. Catherine of Siena.

The group at St. Mary's started with Saint John Paul II's *Letter to Women* and is currently studying Pope John Paul II's Apostolic Letter on *The Christian Meaning of Human Suffering (Salvifici Doloris)*. They meet in the church offices from 9:15 a.m. to 10:15 a.m. on Sundays following the schedule of Christian Education. The material for the study is read and discussed during the meeting and each course is approximately eight weeks long.

Last week the group discussed how "suffering is not in itself a guarantee of holiness; it is what we do with it and whether we learn from it that is the defining factor. While

we may not be able to control every event in our life, we do have control over how we respond to those events. In the end, our biggest challenges in life will not be whether or not we will face suffering, but whether we will waste it."

The group will finish the study on the Christian Meeting of Suffering on Feb. 2 and is inviting all women of the parish to join them on their next study — "*Teacher of Prayer — Saint Teresa of Avila.*"

The Saint Teresa study will begin on **Sunday, Feb. 9** and last for approximately eight weeks. With the church subsidy, the cost of the study is \$15 and is collected during the first class. If you would like to join the class, **please call or e-mail the parish office by Jan. 30 so that books may be ordered in time for the first class.**

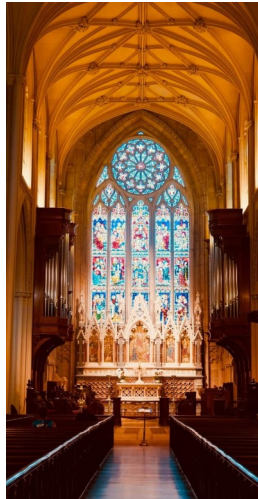
The study will explore the spiritual wisdom of Saint Teresa contained in her book *The Interior Castle*. St. Teresa described the interior communion that is possible with God as the communication to the "soul with such genuine love that neither the affection of a

mother, with which she tenderly caresses her child, nor a brother's love, nor any friendship is comparable to it." The saint also noted that all people can make progress in holiness "through works of charity to their neighbors" and "the governing of the household."

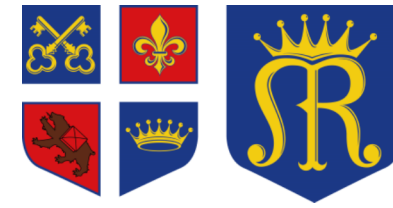

The Holy Gospel

Matthew 4:12-23

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew into Galilee; and leaving Nazareth he went and dwelt in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: "The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, toward the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles-- the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned."

From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."
