To facilitate the widest possible participation of the faithful and a common celebration of the Solemnity of Title, the Chair of St. Peter the Apostle is transferred from Saturday, 22 February to this Sunday (otherwise the date of Quinquagesima), per provisions of *Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year* and the Calendar and according to *Divine Worship's* Table of Precedence. The *Gloria*, Tract and Creed are sung or said.

This Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, confessions will be heard from 11:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. After the Peni-

tential Office for Blessing and Imposition of Ashes at 12:00 p.m., confessions will continue during the Mass and will end promptly at 2:00 pm.

Another Mass with the Blessing and Imposition of Ashes will be held at 7:00 p.m.

Stations of the Cross

Beginning this Friday, February 28 and continuing every Friday through April 3rd, there will be Stations of the Cross with Adoration & Benediction here at St. Mary the Virgin from 7:00-8:00 p.m. in the church.

Fasting Guidelines

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.


