
Hi Second Graders,

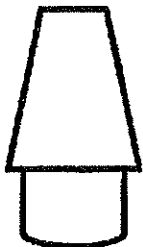

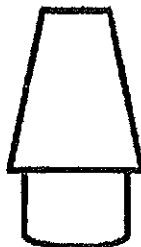

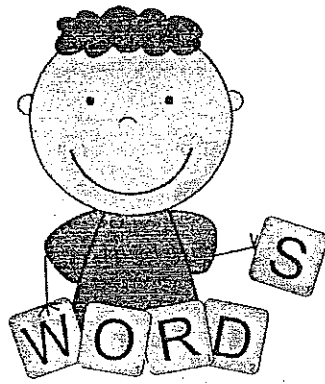

Dear Parents,

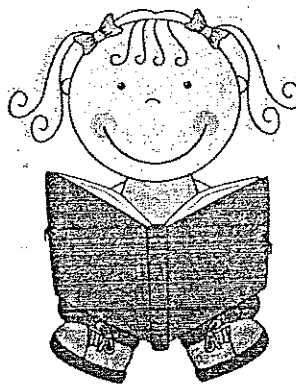
