STATIONS OF THE CROSS

We will have Stations of the Cross in the church every Tuesday evening during Lent at 7:30pm after the 7:00pm Mass



During Lent, **penance** is an important requirement of the Christian life. Fulfillment of this duty involves **prayer, works of piety and charity, and self-denial** by fulfilling one's obligation more faithfully and especially by observing the prescribed fast and abstinence.

Fridays are days of **abstinence from meat**, but Catholics may substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of **fasting and abstinence from meat**.

Fasting is a penitential discipline and obtains its full meaning when we deprive ourselves of food in order to be more open to prayer, to identify with world hunger, and to help us to give to the poor. It helps open our hearts to God and others, a means of spiritual liberation, a witness of the depth of our faith.

Abstinence from meat binds everyone who is **14 and older**. **Fasting** binds those from **18 to 59 years of age**. Parents and educators are reminded of their duty to introduce children gradually to the understanding and practice of penance. May You have A Blessed Lent,
