

From the Desk of Father Steve: Allowing the Saints to Teach us About Lent



Starting this Sunday, and for the rest of the Lenten Season, I would like share with you lessons and writings from some of the great saints of our Church, and specifically what they have to say about Lenten practices that we are supposed to be increasing during this time, such as prayer, fasting and almsgiving. I am doing this for two reasons. First, because I think it is good for us as Catholics to have lots of opportunities to hear from the great minds and spiritual masters of our tradition. There is so much incredible spiritual writings available for us to learn from and to pray with! Second, because it would be difficult for me to continue the previous bulletin series in which I was speaking about the following Sunday's upcoming Gospel reading during Lent. This is because at Holy Spirit, we have three catechumens who will be coming into the Church at the Easter Vigil, and at each 11:00am Sunday Mass during Lent, the Sunday scripture readings will be different for that Mass than for the other Masses of the weekend. Due to the fact that we will be celebrating the Scrutinies with the catechumens at the 11:00am Sunday Mass on the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent, the readings for that Mass will be from Year A of the three year cycle, while the readings at the Two Harbors Saturday evening Mass and the readings at St. Mary's in Silver Bay will be from Year B in the three year cycle. This would obviously make writing about the upcoming Sunday Gospel reading difficult, since the Gospel may be different depending on which Mass a person attends.

So, I'd like to share with you some beautiful writings and thoughts for meditation on Lenten themes from some of the great spiritual writers of the Church. This weekend, I am sharing with you from one of my favorite writers- St. John Chrysostom. This excerpt is from a homily that he gave (he lived during the 5th century) on prayer. Enjoy!

God Bless~ Fr. Steve

Prayer and converse with God is a supreme good: it is a partnership and union with God. As the eyes of the body are enlightened when they see light, so our spirit, when it is intent on God, is illumined by his infinite light. I do not mean the prayer of outward observance but prayer from the heart, not confined to fixed times or periods, but continuous throughout the day and night.

Our spirit should be quick to reach out toward God not only when it is engaged in meditation; at other times also, when it is carrying out its duties, caring for the needy, performing works of charity, giving generously in the service of others, our spirit should long for God, and call him to mind, so that these works may be seasoned with the salt of God's love, and so make a palatable offering to the Lord of the universe. Throughout the whole of our lives we may enjoy the benefit that comes from prayer if we devote a great deal of time to it.

Prayer stands before God as an honored ambassador. It gives joy to the spirit, peace to the heart. I speak of prayer, not words. It is the longing for God, love too deep for words, a gift not given by man but by God's grace. The apostle Paul says: We do not know how we are to pray but the Spirit himself pleads for us with inexpressible longings.

When the Lord gives this kind of prayer to someone; he gives him riches that cannot be taken away, heavenly food that satisfies the spirit. One who tastes this food is set on fire with an eternal longing for the Lord: his spirit burns as in a fire of the utmost intensity.

Practice prayer from the beginning. Paint your house with the colors of modesty and humility. Make it radiant with the light of justice. Decorate it with the finest gold leaf of good deeds. Adorn it with the walls and stones of faith and generosity. Crown it with the pinnacle of prayer. In this way you will make it a perfect dwelling place for the Lord. You will be able to receive him as in a splendid palace, and through his grace you will already possess him, his image enthroned in the temple of your spirit.

The Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday is, "the mother of all liturgies" of the Church and this year, in particular, is a Mass you should highly consider attending. We begin in darkness around a fire and experience how the light from the one Easter candle spreads to all, filling the church with light, which reflects more and more souls being filled with the light of Christ. We hear poetry sung that is not at any other liturgy during the year. During this one Mass we hear the whole story of salvation from creation to salvation. This year, with five people entering the Church during the Vigil (one will be coming into full communion later in Easter) we will witness all the sacraments of initiation—Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation—being celebrated. There is no Mass that demonstrates the life and purpose of the Church in the fullness that this one does. Yes, it is long, but don't let that stop you! It's ok for kids (and adults) to get squirmy and need to stretch their legs. It's ok for kids to fall asleep. If you have never been to the Vigil, you will experience many new elements. Attending the Easter Vigil will also be a wonderful way to welcome the newest members of our parish. I hope you'll try it.


