From the Desk of Father Steve: Frequently Asked Questions on Faith: Church bells



I have noticed that the tradition of ringing a small set of bells during certain parts of the Eucharistic prayer at Mass is making a return to regular practice in many parishes. What is the significance of this?

To answer this question, let's first consider the importance of church bells in general. Here I am speaking of larger bells that are typically housed in a bell tower or belfry. Holy Spirit Church has three bells in its bell tower- one which is the original bell from the original wooden church, and two other, smaller bells that were added later. St. Mary's does not currently have a bell tower with physical bells (but that might be a really neat idea for a future project! ☺). The use of large church bells dates all the way back to the 400's AD. Their use seems to have begun at monasteries, as a way to call the monks to their religious exercises and prayers, and it quickly became common for parish churches to have their own bells. Beginning in the 1100's AD, it became the practice to give the bell a name, and to dedicate it to one of the Divine Persons of the Holy Trinity, to the Blessed Virgin Mary, or to one of the saints. The practice of ringing the church bells at 12 pm and 6 pm for the Angelus prayer, which is customary at Holy Spirit, began in the 1300's AD. Traditionally, a new bell for a parish church is first consecrated by being washed with holy water and anointed with sacred oils.

The purpose of ringing the bells is manifold. The bells are rung typically as sign of rejoicing, or as a sign of mourning. Thus we ring the bells at the conclusion of a marriage, and we toll the bell at the conclusion of a funeral. The bells are also rung to alert the faithful that Mass is soon to begin, and to call them to the church for worship. In previous centuries, a church bell was rung during the singing of the "Holy, Holy, Holy," during Mass, to let the townspeople know that the consecration of the Eucharist was about to take place, and the bells were rung again when the priest elevated the consecrated Host and the chalice with the Precious Blood for the adoration of the faithful during the Eucharistic prayer. Blessed bells are also often used during exorcisms, to ward off and irritate evil spirits, who cringe at the ringing of a blessed bell, just as they are repulsed by the sprinkling of holy water or the sight of a blessed candle.

More pertinent to the question above, however, is the use of small bells by the altar servers during Mass. These are called "sacring bells" or "sanctus bells" or sanctuary bells. Like larger, exterior church bells, their purpose is to draw our attention to what is happening at the altar at that moment, and to honor Christ who is truly present in the Most Holy Eucharist. Typically, in current practice, the altar server will ring the sanctus bell once during the Epiclesis, which is the moment where the priest extends his hands over the bread and wine on the altar and calls down the Holy Spirit upon them in order to bless and consecrate them. Then, after the priest consecrates the Sacred Host and the Precious Blood, and elevates each for the people to look upon and worship, the altar server rings the bells three times for each elevation. This is meant to call our minds back to the worship of Christ in the Holy Eucharist, recognizing that it can be easy for us to get distracted or for our minds to wander.

The ringing of the sanctus bells during the celebration of Holy Mass used to be a requirement. With the changes to the sacred liturgy brought about through the Second Vatican Council in the 1960's, the use of the sanctus bells significantly declined. However, this decline was not called for by the Second Vatican Council itself, but rather seemed to happen at the local parish level. In fact, the Church continues to encourage the use of the sanctus bell during the celebration of Mass. In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which is the instruction book for the proper celebration of Mass, paragraph 150 states, "a little before the consecration, when appropriate, a server rings a bell as a signal to the faithful. According to local custom, the server also rings the bell as the priest shows the host and then the chalice." Thus the use of sanctus bells, while not required, is a long-standing custom which adds focus and decorum to the celebration of the Eucharist.
