

Questions about Daily Schedule

What if we get bumped off the internet or my student can't attend a class online during the scheduled time?

Although we would like to have all students available for all classes, we have to accept that it may not work in all situations. If your student loses internet connection, etc. and missed a teacher's lesson, please email the teacher. All live classes will be recorded and these recordings can be sent out if needed.

Because of the amount of time involved to retrieve and post these recorded classes, teachers will NOT be asked to post everything they teach each day. Also note that these recordings can take over an hour or more just to be sent back from Google after the recording has ended. Thus, every effort should be made to connect in when a class is being taught "live" through Google Meet.

By design, the teachers will also be creating some **pre-recorded posts** for students to access as well, and these will be posted in the Google Classroom. For example, the **Morning Announcements** will be pre-recorded so that students can watch this 2 minute assignment sometime between 8am and 9am each school day. By completing this assignment before 9am, your teachers also know you have been able to log in and will be ready to learn at 9am.

For Middle School (5th – 8th grades)

We do ask that each student/family make every effort this week to log in to the beginning of each class if possible. This is where most of the instruction will happen; from there the student can log off and work on assignments at a later time if needed. But by having a student show up to the beginning of each class, the student can at least make some contact with each teacher to hear any special instructions. Middle School teachers also plan to have study hall from 2pm - 3pm each day, where students can check in with any of their teachers for additional instructions/help, and teachers will be available first thing in the morning from 8:30 - 9am for questions as well.

For ALL classes: This week will be a trial run. We have to see what works and what doesn't. Your feedback is appreciated and will help us decide how to further proceed. Open communication is key, especially under these circumstances. Please let us know any other ways we may be able to help during this time.
