

OLG COVID Report: Updated 9-12-21.

Number of On Campus Confirmed COVID Cases: 8 Active & 10 YTD (E22)

OLG employees testing positive: 2 Active & 3 YTD (E22)

OLG employees in COVID Quarantine: 2 Active & 3 YTD (E22)

OLG students testing positive: 7 Active & 15 YTD

OLG students in COVID Quarantine: 9 Active & 26 YTD (E22)

The OLG COVID Task Force Team (TFT) met Sunday, 9-12-21, to review the current health situation within our community and within our school. While OLG has been following protocols that align with local ISD, the recent on-campus transfer of COVID has made it evident to the COVID TFT that these protocols are not strong enough to properly address the current levels of COVID within our community. Thus, in an effort to provide better protection to our students and faculty, and to minimize the potential of a school closure, the following protocols will be reestablished at OLG Catholic School starting Monday, September 13, 2021:

- 1) Faculty continue to be required to wear masks throughout the day (unless outside).
- 2) Grades 5th - 8th are required to wear masks throughout the day (unless outside or when eating in cafeteria).
- 3) Grades K5 - 4th are required to wear masks when in shared school areas (main hallway, bathrooms, library, gym). They are not required to wear masks at their desks.
- 4) PreK4 is required to wear masks when in the main building or gym areas. The COVID team recognizes that wearing a mask for extended periods of time may not be a practical request for most 4 year olds and thus is not mandating masks at this age during the normal school day, but is highly recommending that they try to wear a mask if possible when in the classroom.
- 5) All visitors to the school office must wear a mask prior to being allowed into the building.
- 6) All attendees to daily morning Mass (school and public) will be required to wear masks Mass.

The OLG COVID TFT will continue to monitor the situation weekly to determine when the mask requirements can be revised.

The OLG Volleyball Team will not have practice this week and the out of town game scheduled for this week has been cancelled. Again, the COVID TFT will monitor the health of all team members and staff to determine when practices may resume.

As always, parents should monitor their students closely for any COVID symptoms and keep students home and contact their doctor if they have any reason to believe their student or someone in their household could have COVID.

The COVID TFT is also highly recommending that all students 12 years and up receive the COVID vaccine and that all students receive the Flu shot for this flu season. If you have any questions/concerns about either of these vaccinations, please contact your family doctor to discuss them.

Please continue to keep all our community, our Mariner families, and all healthcare workers in your prayers.

- All COVID Cases are reviewed & confirmed by the OLG COVID Task Force Team made up of local medical professionals.
- Students in confirmed COVID quarantine are placed on Individual Remote Learning Plans.
- YTD values include active & past cases since 8-7-21.
