Chapter 12: Responding to God's Call

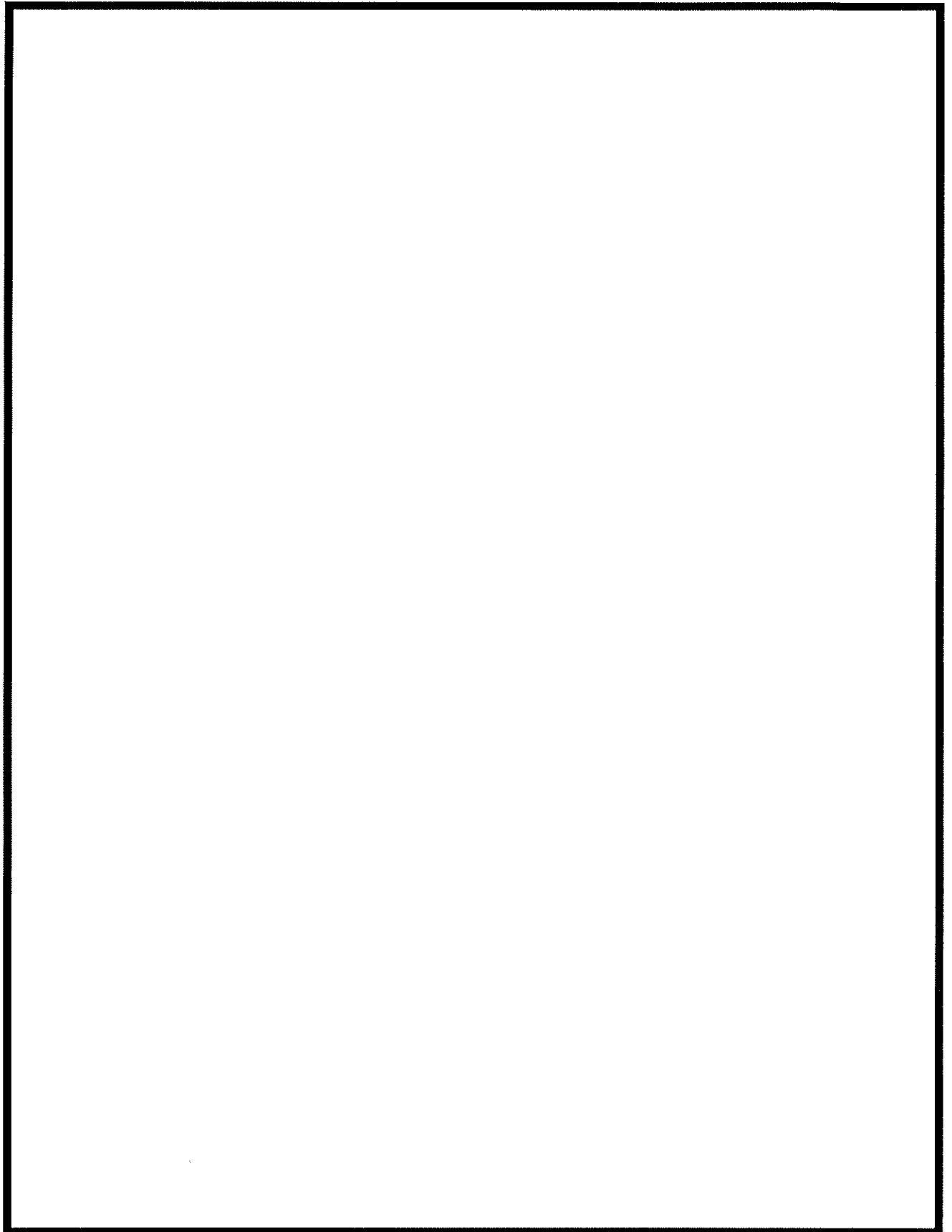

- Imagine that you and your friend both love to play video games. One day, you are at your friend's house playing a brand new game she just got. You

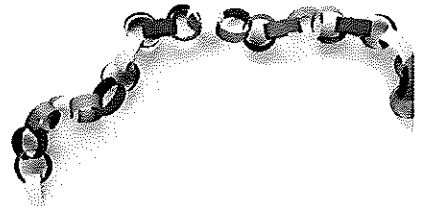

Ash Wednesday/Lent (pg 241-244)

Lent begins on February 26th this year. To help you prepare for Lent, attached to this packet are Lenten Action Cards. You will cut them out and glue them back together to make a chain (see picture below) with your family. Every day of Lent, you will take a link off the chain, read what is on the slip and do it as a family. The first section is filled in for you to get you started, but the rest are blank for your family to come up with Lenten Actions that will help you grow closer to God! (Note: Parents with multiple children in Home-Based FF, this activity is the same for all grades, so you only need to create one Lenten Action Chain per family, not per student).

Send a greeting card or a letter to a relative, friend, or fellow parishioner who is homebound.

Fast from eating food mindlessly, that is, from not even bothering to taste it.

Clean up a common area at work, in the neighborhood, or at home. Do it as your gift for the good of all.

Invite a widowed neighbor to join your family for a meal.
