OHIO BISHOPS ISSUE STATEMENT REGARDING THE SAME-SEX MARRIAGE RULING. The United States Supreme Court released its ruling that states are required to license a marriage between two people of the same sex. This is not the ruling hoped for by the Catholic Church, which believes that marriage is by definition between one man and one woman. For centuries, this definition had been universally accepted in virtually all cultures – secular as well as religious. Every nation has laws limiting who can be married and under what circumstances. This is because lawmakers always have understood that marriage does not exist just for the mutual satisfaction of the two people involved, but for the betterment of society. Traditional marriage is the cradle of the family, the basic building block of society. As Pope Francis has reminded us, every child has a right to be raised by two parents, a father and a mother. Both parents are important, and they are not interchangeable. The sad reality that so many children are deprived of this right because of the crisis in traditional marriage does not make it any less important. It is deeply disappointing and worrisome that our courts do not understand this. The Catholic Church remains steadfast in its commitment to promote and defend marriage defined as the union of one man and one woman. With renewed hope, sensitivity, and compassion, the Church will continue to attend to the challenges and hardships that confront individuals and their families, and to treat all persons with the dignity and respect due to them as children of God.

SCHOOL NEWS, FROM: MR. MEDAUGH, PRINCIPAL:

LOOKING AHEAD: The classroom progress is going pretty well. We are starting to get rid of the old clutter and arrange rooms. Once teachers have had a chance to organize their rooms, we will figure out what to do with the old furniture. We have filled one of our vacancies. April Gable will be our new receptionist. April is the former owner/operator of Jolly Hoppers in Lancaster. The skills she learned managing that business will be an asset to the school. Our search continues for a 5-8 Science/Math teacher. In my meeting with the transportation directors at Crooksville and New Lexington, we briefly touched on bus discipline. These are my thoughts on that matter; 1) I intend to establish a personal relationship with their drivers so that they know what I expect in terms of behavior, and in turn, their expectations. 2) Because Crooksville and New Lexington are transporting our students, the least we can do is have our students behave on their buses. 3) Students wearing St. Rose Catholic School uniforms are a reflection, good or bad, on themselves, our school, and their families. They always need to be mindful of that. I will be attaching a copy of our dress code next week in case you are going to be shopping in the next few weeks. Just a heads up, cowboy boots are not an acceptable part of the school uniform. Every volunteer in a school, program ministry for children and youth, regardless of their level of contact with children, needs to attend *Protecting God’s Children* training. We have scheduled a session at the PCC, lower level on Saturday, August 8th from 9:00 a.m. until noon. Father Reade has arranged for participants to have their background checks done at the sheriff’s office following the presentation. To register, visit www.virtus.org. Space is limited, so please register soon. I will be in the office Tuesday-Thursday from 7:30 a.m.-5:00 p.m. It is very possible that I will be in Monday and Friday as well. I will be at School on Monday and Friday (after meetings in Columbus), July 13-17. This past week, we completed the school’s safety plan in order to be compliant with the Ohio Dept. of Education and Homeland Security. Kitty Quinn was a big help as a resource with this project as were the folks at NaviGate. We also updated the school volunteer list for the Columbus Diocese’s Safe Environment office for the upcoming school year. In addition, we have been getting information together for SchoolSpeak which will allow parents and guardians to view grades and the school information online. It was a busy month in June, and July will be an even busier month. Parents, if you haven’t registered with the tuition management company, FACTS, please do so this week. In his book, *Living the Mass*, Joe Paprocki deals with how we should utilize our time, talents and treasure.

Paprocki tells that our talents can be recognized in our skills, in our interests, and in our personalities. "The opportunity to use our talents to serve the needs of others and to bring glory to God is, in itself, a gift." Jesus taught those around him as he teaches us, our talents are meant to be used, not hoarded to ourselves. When we share ourselves appropriately, we are able to share our talents and gifts with the larger community. I have been a teacher for thirty-eight years. During that time, I have seen students, teachers, parents, and supporters utilize their talents in so many wonderful ways. It is one of the great joys of the profession. The artwork that has been produced, the clever poems that have been written, the peacemakers who have solved group issues, are indicators of time and talents well used. Part of our job at St. Rose Catholic School is to help each student find his/her talents and then present opportunities in which they might develop those talents...Hope you had a joyful and safe holiday!
