SCHOOL NEWS, FROM:MR. MEDAUGH, PRINCIPAL:

LOOKING AHEAD: We want to extend our appreciation again for all those who came out in the rain and helped move the furniture we received from St. Brigid's. It was a long day, but well worth it. Part of the furniture from St. Brigid's included desks our teachers can use. Therefore, we are getting rid of several very heavy steel teachers' desks. If you would like one of these desks, please let Mr. Mitch or Mr. Medaugh know. They would be good as work stations in garages, barns, etc. Mr. Mitch has been busy cleaning rooms with his crew and we are slowly seeing progress in configuring the new furniture. I think you will be impressed with the results. The principal at St. Brigid's commented to me as I was leaving Dublin that she wondered what her school would look like in our building. I still think we can get the bulk of the heavy work done in the next two weeks. (Feel free to stop by and help if you have time.) I interviewed ten people for various positions. The interviews went very well and many possibilities resulted from discussions with these folks. I only have three more interviews and will have made my final decision about our new 5-8 math/science teacher and our new receptionist by June 30th. I have met with Dave Rupe, the Transportation Director at New Lexington, and Debbie Reed, the Transportation Director at Crooksville. We discussed schedules and bus discipline. It was an extremely beneficial meeting and I am excited about working with them next year. Please be sure to document your volunteer hours and turn them in to the school office. Mrs. Medaugh and I have developed an accounting procedure and I hope to give you accurate, timely report about your hours. Just be sure to turn in your documented hours. We are reviewing all the Ed Choice Expansion applications we have received. If you haven't filed, please consider doing so in the near future. We may be getting in touch with you if we need more information.

One of my favorite books is *Living the Mass* by Fr. Dominic Grassi and Joe Paprocki. In this book, the authors tell us how to use the Mass as a guide for our behavior the rest of the week. Chapter 8, "*Stewards of God's Gifts*" deals with the preparation of the Gifts at Mass. This chapter asks us to consider that God has given us our

time, talents, and treasures and we are asked to respond by donating part of those things back. "In the Profession of Faith we proclaim our belief and our trust in God as the creator of all things visible and invisible. In this creed, we are expressing our belief that everything we have is a Gift from God." Paprocki goes on to write, "Catholics believe we are called to live as stewards of God's creation – recognizing that all that we are and all that we have belongs to God." Paprocki then concludes that we really have no ownership over our time talents, and treasures, but that those items have been entrusted to us. "Stewardship calls Catholics to care responsibly for God's gifts and to share generously of our time, talent, and treasures."
