All Things Are Possible with God

In this weekend's gospel passage (Mark 10:17-30) Jesus gives a sobering warning about the danger of letting anything take the place of God as the very center and source of our life. After Jesus invited a wealthy young man to sell his possessions and follow Jesus, assuring him that he would have treasure in heaven (Mk 10:21), the young man went away sad, unable to walk away from his wealth to follow Jesus. In turn, Jesus said, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God?" (Mk 10:23)

We read in Mark 10 that the disciples were astonished by this incident and even asked Jesus, "Then who can be saved?" (Mk 10:26) Jesus, replied "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." (Mk 10:27) There is great encouragement for each one of us in these words. Whatever you have gone through, whatever you are going through...God has the grace you need.

Whether it be an awareness of needing to reorder our lives to have better balance, or a particularly difficult situation in our lives, Jesus promises, "I am with you always." (Mt 28:20) It's common to not *feel* like praying in tough times. Yet it's then, when God's grace pours in ever powerfully to sustain, restore and guide us. It's then that the words of Jesus become incarnate in us: ***all things are possible for God!***

Families of Parishes Update

This past Thursday, we celebrated the commission mass for our family clergy at a mass at Ss. Peter and Paul. As a team, the priests and deacons will meet twice a month and seek to support each other in caring for the parishes in the family. An immediate fruit of this collaboration is that the family priests will begin a rotation, taking turns to cover the Sunday mass at Presentation Our Lady of Victory. In due time, we look forward to another gathering (akin to the gathering at St. Scholastica) that will give us an opportunity to keep growing in our relationship with the parishes and parishioners in our family.

Everyday Stewardship

Today's First Reading from the Book of Wisdom shows us that the *spirit of Wisdom* is far more valuable than gold and silver.

This topic is echoed in St. Mark's Gospel: Jesus tells the rich man that if he desires to be His disciple, in addition to following God's commandments, he must sell all that he has and give to the poor. The rich man is unable to do this, and sadly walks away.

This Gospel passage is radically counter-cultural to today's worldly quest for wealth. The Letter to the Hebrews also reminds us that we must give an accounting to God of how we steward His abundant gifts bestowed upon us.

Did we use them to build up His Kingdom? If we were in the rich man's place, what would be our response to the Lord's challenge?

Are we willing to make generous, sacrificial gifts of prayer, service, and generosity to our parish's ministries and weekly offertory, to the Catholic Services Appeal and those in need, and other worthy causes? Those who do, discover that God's generosity is never outdone. Begin the Biblical practice of tithing by giving a sacrificial percentage of your income back to the Lord. Try to increase that percentage each year until you reach the 10 percent tithe. And then, do more if you are able.

St. Joseph: Faithful Protector of Mother and Child

The infant Christ “came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph” (PC 5). The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him “an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble” (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say “yes” to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was “chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true ‘miracle’ by which God saves the child and his mother” (PC 5).

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life. *Dear St. Joseph, you who were “able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence” (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage*

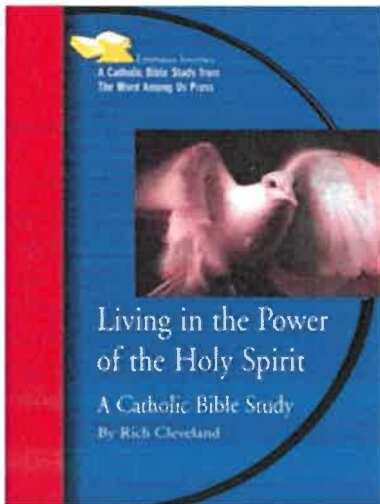

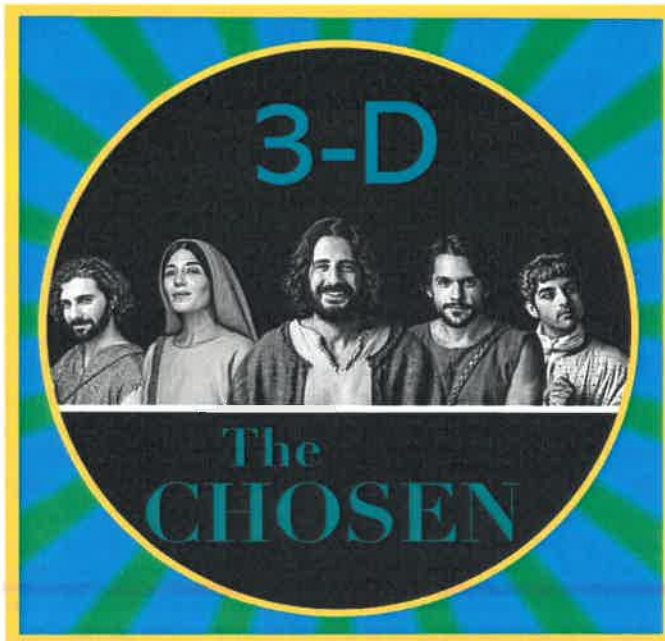
