If students have antibodies, do they still have to wear a mask?

Yes.

Why don't students in PK-K wear a mask?

We highly encourage that they do wear a mask, but understand that students this young may struggle with keeping it on all day, and at times, may cause them to touch their face more often than if they did not.

Will spare masks be available?

Yes. We have both adult and child sized masks available.

What are the new, updated list of symptoms of COVID-19?

- Fever (100* or greater)
- Chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Abdominal pain
- Diarrhea

This health screening checklist can also be found on the back of your carline tag. Please review these symptoms **EACH** morning to ensure your child(ren) are arriving to school symptom free.

Will contact tracers outside of the school be able to contact or speak with the students?

No, we are a closed campus, so there will be no visitors allowed on campus. Furthermore, contract tracers would not try to speak directly with a child, they would reach out to the adults.

What types of COVID-19 testing does the school accept?

When a COVID-19 test is needed for a student, he or she must get a diagnostic test. While families are welcome to get an antibody test for their own information, the results of an antibody test have no bearing on the protocols or requirements for students learning on campus. For example, if a parent provides an antibody test showing a student has had the virus, this student will still have to wear a mask and follow all the same safety protocols as his/her peers.

Where can we go to get COVID-19 testing done?

Depending on the type of test, and turn around time, there are plenty of options around the area. Your best bet is to simply do a google search to find out the location, and type of test you are looking for. These vary based on whether or not an appointment is needed, turn around time, limitations on who can get tested, as well as drive-through options.

How will CtRCS ensure daycares, such as the ones who pick up from CtR, will follow the same guidelines as our school?

This is not something we can ensure, just as we can't ensure that families are following any specific protocols at home or during their outings.

Are the students in aftercare also remaining in cohorts?

Yes, but their cohort will be their grade level, as we have very small numbers of students enrolled in aftercare.

In the hallways, how can we prevent many students from being in a smaller space?

We limit the number of students in the hallways, the entry points and exit points, and have removed as many transitions as possible. In addition, all students are required to wear a mask in the hallways.

If students are at home sick, can they participate virtually for the day?

Students who are out sick may not participate virtually for the day as this would place an additional burden on the teacher to manage a fluctuating group of virtual learners each day. If a student will be absent for an extended period of time due to COVID-19 related issues, then yes, they will be allowed to join the class virtually.

What is the name of the microbial treatment being used to spray surfaces? How often is this happening?

The following cleaners will be used on campus: ***Diversey Morning Mist 5 RTD Neutral Disinfectant/Cleaner, Diversey Final Step 5 No-Rinse 512 Sanitizer, BIOESQUE Botanical Disinfectant Solution.***

Faculty/staff members are responsible for cleaning high touch surface areas prior to student arrival, after dismissal, and at least once throughout the day.

Will hot lunches be cold grab and go type lunches or hot meals?

Justus & Co. has published the [September Lunch Menu](#). You will be able to select lunch choices monthly and will be similar to September's selections. All lunches will be delivered to the classrooms, with the exception of PreK and Kindergarten who will eat in the Parish Hall.
