CFP Attendance Policy 2019-2020

Prioritizing faith development is necessary for spiritual growth. Illness cannot be helped. If your child is ill and will miss class, please notify Beverly Donahue at (513) 398-3821 ext. 3111 or email her at donahueb@stsusanna.org. When leaving a message or email, please indicate the child's name, grade level, and catechist.

Attendance records are kept on file with the Program Administrator. It is important that parents prioritize Christian Formation for their child(ren) each week. ***We ask that families do not schedule extra-curricular activities that conflict with CFP.** Families must make up missed lessons and assignments and give them to the student's catechist at the next class date.

CFP Grade 8 - Make-Up Lesson Instruction 2019-2020

To make up a lesson, please complete the following:

- **Step 1-** Refer to the Curriculum Schedule (in student folder and online <https://www.stsusanna.org/cfp>). Each grade is different, so please make sure you are looking at the correct grade to see the lesson/date that was missed.
- **Step 2-** Student should read through the lesson they missed in their **CHOSEN** book. The video segments are for in class only, access is for catechists/leaders (so you will skip the videos).
*Read through the lesson, and any Scripture or Catechism references- use your Bible and *Catechism of the Catholic Church*.
- **Step 3 –** Student & Parent Discussion: Parent discusses lesson with their child using the **CHOSEN Parent Guide** booklet. Sponsor and student can also have discussion with the **Sponsor Guide**.
- **Step 4 –** Student completes the **Challenge of the Week** section in their **CHOSEN** book and writes any part of that lesson in the book.
 - Then, on a separate sheet of paper, student - **write (type) a 2 paragraph reflection** on what you learned and how it applies to your life. Please be thoughtful and complete.
 - Include your **NAME** (First and Last) on the paper and title **CFP 8th grade make up**
 - Turn this paper in to your catechist in class when you return to the next CFP session.
