**In the Eucharistic Prayer, through the Priest's words and actions and the power of the Holy Spirit, the bread and wine are consecrated. Christ is present with us in the bread and wine: they are now his Body and Blood.**

Page 56 - Our Spiritual Food - read

**At the Last Supper, Jesus told us to remember him by celebrating a special meal. It's a special kind of remembering that we do when we celebrate Mass. At Mass, Jesus' sacrifice of love is made present and we offer ourselves to God with Jesus.**

**During the Eucharistic Prayer, we sing or say this or another prayer. It shows that we believe that Jesus shows his love for us.**

**We end by praying *Amen*. This prayer is our "yes" to all that was prayed during the Eucharistic Prayer.**
