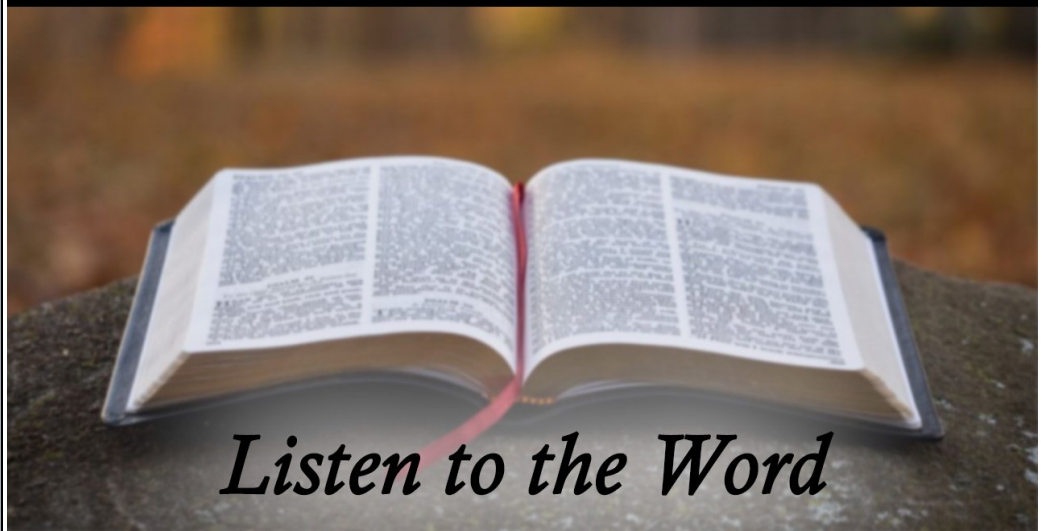

### **This Week: Listen to the Word**

Today's readings remind us that the Gospel is the truth. We need this truth to pursue what is truly good in life, not illusions.

In the First Reading, Moses is about to part ways with the Israelites. He promises them a prophet will be sent to teach them after he is gone. Ultimately, Jesus, the Son who was sent by the Father, is the one who teaches us the truth about God's will for our lives.

The crowds in today's Gospel, see something different in this young rabbi from Nazareth who is just starting His teaching/public ministry. Why do His words have weight to them that they did not find in their scribes? Because they bear the weight of truth.

Something resonates in us when we hear the truth. The crowds in today's Gospel know our Lord's teaching rings true because it speaks to something in their hearts, be it a call to conversion or a confirmation of the upright life they desire to lead. We need the truth and our Lord is the truth in person.

The Gospel has been preached for thousands of years and it is still the truth that sets us free now. Let us listen to our Lord with renewed attention through His Word, confident that it is the truth, and that it is alive and active in the world today. Jesus wants to save us, just as much as He wanted to save the possessed man in today's Gospel. We are mostly likely not possessed, but at the same time worries, frustrations, suffering and temptations can have power over us, our words, and our actions.

How can He reach us? How can His liberating words and saving grace touch our lives in those moments that we need liberation most? We can experience the authority of His words and the power of His grace in our personal prayer, in the liturgy as we gather around His Word every Sunday at Mass, in the confessional, or in the Eucharist.

This Jesus who saves is not a hero from the past like Socrates or Alexander the Great. He is just as real, alive, and present today as He was in that synagogue almost two thousand years ago. He is in the Eucharist, in the tabernacle, every day and every night, as the sanctuary lamp reminds us. Whenever we need to let the power of His grace fortify our tired and weak souls, we can do so in the Church or in the Adoration Chapel. In addition, Jesus is present in the confessional, through the ministry of His priest. Whenever we need to be cleansed, forgiven, and healed by His grace, we

can find him there, the very same Jesus who expelled demons and astonished the crowds.

Jesus is also present in the Bible. The Bible is the only book in the whole world directly inspired by the Holy Spirit. When our worried, frustrated, or weary hearts need to hear His words of wisdom, we can find Him there. In addition, Jesus is present among us in the liturgy, because he promised that wherever two or three gather in His name, He will be there.

Christ is alive around and in us. He is eager to bring His light into any dark corner of our heart or world. Will we let Him? Will we actively seek out His presence and listen to the Word who can make the difference in our lives?

Blessed be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

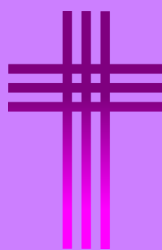
