CHAPTER 17

Grade 1 - The First Christians

"Christians believe in Jesus Christ and try to do what he taught; Christians today show their love for one another just as the first Christians did."

Grade 3 – Happiness with God

"God gives us the grace to share in His divine life and to live happy and holy lives; Jesus promised us the gift of eternal life and happiness in Heaven."

Grade 4 - Created in God's Image

"We are each created with a body and a soul; God gave us an intellect and free will to help us make good moral decisions."

Grade 5 - Called to Holiness

"When we live as images of God, we live truly holy lives; the grace of God helps us live holy lives."

Grade 6/7 – Our Call to Holiness

"The theological virtues are gifts from God that strengthen us to live lives of holiness; the Grace of the Holy Spirit helps us grow in holiness; living the works of mercy is a sign we are trying to live holy lives

Theme: Put On Love

"Over all of these, put on love, that is, the bond of perfection." (Colossians 3:14)

Background

The main focus of this chapter includes: how Christians show their love for one another just as the first Christians did; all people are to be honored and respected; God gives us the grace to live holy and happy lives; we are created with a body and soul and with the gifts of an intellect and a free will that helps us make good moral decisions; when we live as images of God, we live holy lives; the grace of God helps us live holy lives and theological virtues are gifts from God that connect us with him and strengthen us to live lives of holiness.

Main Focus

- We are called to holiness and to "put on love."

Starting prayer

(Have children bow their heads and remember that God is present with them in this time and place. Bless yourself with the sign of the cross.)

Loving God,

You created us in your own image and likeness.

Be with us and bless us as we learn how to live as your children.

Teach us what it means to "put on love."

How do you "put on love" during your day to day activities?

Ask your children this question. Listen to the examples that they give and add a few of your own.

What opportunities do you have within your family to "put on love?"

Pg. 161 – Have the children complete the Chapter review.

CHAPTER 18

Grade 1 - We Love God

"The Ten Commandments teach us to worship God; they teach us to speak God's name with love and respect and to take part in Mass on Sunday."

Grade 3 – God's Laws of Love

"The first commandment teaches us to love God above all else; The second commandment teaches us to love God by honoring his name; the third Commandment teaches us to love God by keeping holy the Lord's Day."

Grade 4 – The Beatitudes

"God wants everyone to be blessed and truly happy; living the beatitudes leads to happiness with God."

Grade 5 – Making Moral Decisions

"Moral decisions help us grow as children of God and live as followers of Jesus Christ; conscience is our ability to know and judge what is right and what is wrong; the cardinal virtues help us live holy lives."

Grade 6/7 – Making Moral Choices

"Sin is turning away from God; the source of morality are the object of the act, the intention of the agent, and the circumstance surrounding the act; our conscience helps us judge whether an act is good or bad."

Theme: Seek the Lord

"Happy those who observe God's decree, who seek the Lord with all their hearts."

(Psalm 119:2)

Background

The main focus of this chapter includes: the Ten Commandments which teach us to worship God; Jesus taught us the Greatest Commandment; the first, second and third commandments teach us to love God; the Beatitudes guide us in making choices that lead to happiness; moral decisions help us grow as children of God and live as followers of Jesus Christ; our consciences help us to judge whether or not an act is good or evil.

Main Focus

- In all we do, we "seek the Lord."

Starting prayer

(Have children bow their heads and remember that God is present with them in this time and place. Bless yourself with the sign of the cross.)

Loving God,

Be with us and bless us as we learn to follow your decrees and to seek you always.

How can following God's love help us be happy? How can seeking God with all our hearts help us to be happy?

Ask your children this question. Listen to the examples that they give and add a few of your own. Suggest that following God's law and seeking Him in everything we do is a path to happiness.

How do you "seek the Lord" in your family?

In the Book

CHAPTER 19

Grade 1 - We Love Others

"We are to treat ourselves and others as children of God; we are to show respect for other people and tell the truth."

Grade 3 – Love One Another

Grade 4 – Living A Holy Life

"Conscience and the virtues help us make good moral choices; sin is freely choosing to say or do something we know is against God's will; the Gifts of the Holy Spirit help us choose to live as followers of Jesus."

Grade 5 – Living the Covenant

"We are a covenant people; God gave Moses the Ten Commandments to guide us in living the covenant; Jesus, the Son of God, is the new and everlasting covenant."

Grade 6/7 - The Law of Love

"Do good and avoid evil is a principle of the Natural Law; Love of God and love of neighbor is essentially the Great commandment; The Law of love is the way we are called to be friends with Jesus and with one another."

"Come, Follow me." (Luke 18:22)

Background

Main Focus

- Jesus invites us to follow Him and to be His disciples.

Starting prayer

(Have children bow their heads and remember that God is present with them in this time and place. Bless yourself with the sign of the cross.)

Loving God,

Be with us and bless us as we seek to respond to your Son Jesus' invitation, "Come, follow me".

Ask your children this question. Listen to the examples that they give and add a few of your own. Would they want to ask Jesus any questions about what it means to follow him? What do they think Jesus would say?

"Rejoice and be glad" (Matthew 5:12)

Background

The main focus of this chapter includes: The Great Commandment, the Ten Commandments, we live the covenant when we love God with our whole heart; Jesus came to show us how to live the Ten Commandments; the beatitudes; the law of love.

Main Focus

- Jesus' disciples "rejoice and be glad"

Starting prayer

(Have children bow their heads and remember that God is present with them in this time and place. Bless yourself with the sign of the cross.)

Loving God.

Be with us and bless us as we seek to respond to your son Jesus' invitation to be His disciples. We rejoice and are glad because we follow His command.

Discuss the following questions/ideas

- 1. Jesus teaches us to love God above all else. Jesus also teaches us to love one another. What do these teachings mean to you?
- 2. What are some of the other teachings of Jesus you can share? What do these teachings mean to you?
- 3. What are the Beatitudes? Can you name a few of them?

How does living as a disciple of Jesus cause you to "rejoice and be glad?"
