Minutes:

1. Enrollment has remained the same since last month.
2. Distance Wednesdays - Mr. Minelli has been meeting with Elise Hochhausler on a daily basis to review the most recent health data. He has also been discussing the return to five days in person with the faculty. The transportation department in all three public schools need a 2 week notice for the return.
 - a. The plan is to return in person five days a week starting the week of Nov 9th.
 - b. A letter will be written and reviewed by the school board that will be sent out to all parents explaining the plan. The plan will also stress that this plan could change as the health data changes.
 - c. Decisions about full time remote that may come are out of our control.
3. School Spectacular - Mr. Minelli and the School Spectacular committee have been meeting and planning the event to be socially distanced and safe. The silent auction and basket raffle will be available online too.
4. Hiring – Both new teachers are working with us every day.
 - a. Mrs. Misty Jandron is teaching English and Literature to our 7th grade students.
 - b. Mrs. Madison Caldwell is our full-time 3rd grade teacher.
5. eLearning – Zach Collins is continuing to work with Dell to resolve issues with the computers.
6. Walk for Technology – The walk generated \$17,394.75. This is compared to the previous two years of reaching \$10,000. Funds will be used to purchase laptops for the 3rd grade.
7. Teachers report, Mrs. Zipperer – Donations are being accepted by grade level for themed baskets for the Spectacular. Technology issues continue but are less than earlier in the year. Email continues to be especially problematic.
8. CRE report, Mrs. Molulon – There will be no Bible Bowl or service projects held away from school this year due to the pandemic. Students will work on doing small projects at school for Heartland Hospice patients.

9. PTO report, Kyle Weiler – The PTO is thinking about putting on a carnival in the spring. They have saved everything they would have used last spring if we had not been on lock down.
