Ash Wednesday Fast & Abstinence

March 6 marks the beginning of the 40 days of Lent. The following fasting and abstinence regulations are observed.

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older. We refrain from eating meat because Jesus sacrificed his flesh on Good Friday.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. One full meatless meal is taken and two much smaller meatless meals are permitted if absolutely necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Most important is your attitude! Fasting & abstinence only benefit those who practice them with the intention of drawing closer to God & achieving self discipline. Internal desire and external practice work together to make us holy.

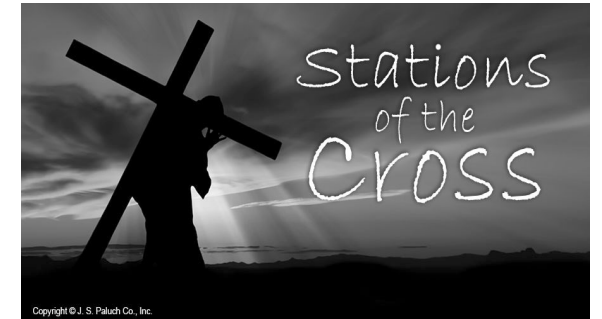
