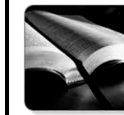

The Assumption of the blessed Virgin Mary

In 1950, Pope Pius XII proclaimed the Assumption of Mary a dogma of the Catholic Church in these words: "The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heaven." The Assumption was declared a truth revealed by God. It is celebrated on the church calendar on August 15th. Usually, a holyday of obligation, but this year, since the feast falls on a Saturday, it is not a holyday. However, there will be a Mass at St. Roch to celebrate Mary's Assumption at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 14.

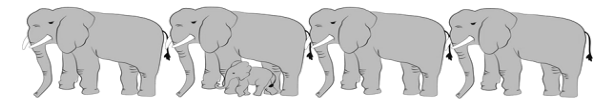

Weekly Reflection ~ August 16 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time
