Monday, May 13 is the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima. In 1917, Our Blessed mother appeared to three young shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal with a message for the world to do penance and pray. She specifically encouraged the recitation of the Rosary (preferably daily) and offering up our hardships to God for the forgiveness of sins and in reparation to Mary's Immaculate Heart.

The following prayer is added by many at the end of each decade of the Rosary. It is referred to as the Fatima Prayer.
