Essential Questions recur in all grades, deepening understanding as lessons building on faith concepts in developmentally appropriate ways each year. Access to digital tools and resources is a hallmark of this program, supporting engagement and easing communication between the school and families. Tools and resources are mobile friendly and available anytime, anywhere on most internet-enabled devices. Lesson-planning tools are flexible so teachers can prep anywhere. A digital project portfolio supports creativity and witness with innovative tasks that challenge disciples to apply what they've learned to their own lives.
