### **“CARE FOR OUR EARTH”**

The following are excerpts I wove together from an article in the *Huffington Post* written by Stephen Cohen.

He begins by stating that a key question as we make our LONG transition to a sustainable and renewable economy and culture is the role of individual responsibility and personal lifestyle. The causes of the sustainability crisis are far from simple; they are quite complex and intermeshed. Sustainability requires both individual and systems level change; both are highly interdependent. In considering sustainability from an environmental perspective the problems that arise can only be solved when we put ourselves on a consumption diet and stop our super-sized, resource intensive lifestyles. Over consumption in the developed world leads directly to problems of extreme poverty across the globe.

Our economic and political systems are dependent on economic growth, and economic growth CAN be separated from environmental destruction. According to the writer the answer is not to reduce consumption but CHANGE it; develop different patterns of consumption. In the writer’s view a positive view of a renewable economy is sound political strategy. A sustainable, urban lifestyle may well be emerging with smaller personal spaces, bikes, parks, high tech media, and constant attention to one’s environmental footprint.
