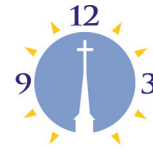
### **MIX- UP WITH ENVELOPES:**

## **"CARE FOR OUR EARTH"**

Have you given much thought to people's reasons for rejecting human-activated Climate change (I like the phrase, global climate disruption, coined by the Journalist, Stephen Nash) when there is such strong, factual evidence to the contrary? I believe that one reason is their conviction that the changing climate is just part of the natural cycle of the weather that our earth experiences. Another reason could be that they place more trust in the small group of scientists who deny that the change is human-activated. Another is their acceptance of the propaganda circulated by the industries which profit from fossil fuels. Then, there are those who do not see any major negative consequences currently happening. With regard to this final reason noted, I would compare the immediate occurrence of global climate disruption to some people's physical care of themselves. They engage in little to no exercise and their diet consists of much saturated and transfat food, which does taste delicious. But these people are gradually laying the foundation for and nurturing serious health problems like strokes and heart trouble. These problems slowly result over a period of time. So, too, with global climate disruption; the signs do not occur all at once, but gradually over a period of time. The deniers however, do serve a worthwhile role in that they challenge the believers to research more deeply to confirm the reality.
