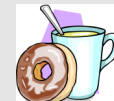

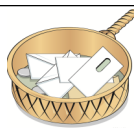


LAWN MOWER

Don't Miss These Symbolisms at Your Next Mass

As Catholics who have gone to countless Masses, we know the order of the different parts of the Mass, and the responses to the priest's prompts come quite instinctively. But most Catholics might miss the symbolisms built in the liturgy because, well, we never knew they were there. Listed here are some of those symbols in words, objects, and gestures.

4th in a Series

The Word and the Eucharist

Every sacrament starts with the Word of God that prompts our desire to receive grace. In the Gospels and in the Acts of the Apostles, we read that people listen to the disciples "opening" Scripture, and they respond to it. For example, the baptism of the Ethiopian eunuch is a response to Philip opening Scripture to him. Another example is when Jesus explained Scripture to the two disciples walking to Emmaus before he "broke bread" with them. This is the structure of the Mass, isn't it? In both parts of the Mass, then, we receive the word of God in Scripture, and the living Word of God - Jesus Christ - in the Eucharist.

Knights of Columbus

"The Family Fully Alive" Program

Families need to set aside a definite time for formal prayer together in order to have prayer infuse everything they do. Family members must build their life around God rather than fit God into their busy schedule. It is necessary to develop a rhythm because life is shaped by rhythms: the rhythm of heartbeat and breathing, the rhythm of day and night, of meals, of weeks, and so on. The theme for the month of June is:

SELF-GIVING LOVE

As the primary educators of their children, mothers and fathers have many responsibilities. One of the most fundamental practices they must teach is self-giving love. Self-giving love not only places the good of another ahead of one's personal good, but also sees another's good as one's own good. The most fundamental lessons of love are taught through ordinary daily life in the rhythm of a home in which God is loved and adored above all things. Through the struggles of daily life, acts of service and kind words, children learn the language of love from their mother and father. June is traditionally devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, celebrated each year as a solemnity on a Friday 19 days after Pentecost. (It was June 8 this year.) The Sacred Heart devotion reveals the burning love of God in Jesus Christ, a love which is stronger than death and given to us in the sacraments.

Consider these questions:

1. What do we learn from our family? Have we learned "the art of living"? If so, of what does this "art of living" consist?
2. What is self-giving love?
3. How have we learned about self-giving love from our family?
