PRACTICE OF FAITH

All Saint’s Day is an opportunity to reflect on what it means to live as children of God. We find witnesses to this way of life in the saints who have taken to heart Jesus’ words and example. The Beatitudes describe the mystery of holiness, that true happiness is found in acts of self-giving. In whom have you observed the lived reality described in the Beatitudes?

Las Bienaventuranzas, vías de santidad

En el evangelio de hoy, Mateo nos presenta uno de los discursos más hermosos y profundos de Jesús, las bienaventuranzas. Muchas veces pensamos que las señales de la santidad se refieren solamente a aquellas experiencias místicas o sobrenaturales. Sin embargo, por la lectura del evangelio de hoy podemos darnos cuenta de que son muchas las formas de poder emitir ese olor a santidad, sobre todo en vida.

Cada vez que uno de nosotros lucha por mantener ese espíritu pobre, entendiéndose esto como la actitud de humildad para reconocer la presencia de Dios en todo aquello que nos enseñan su bondad, tanto en el actuar como en sus enseñanzas, así como en toda la creación, eso es vivir en santidad. Cuando lloramos porque nos duele ver la injusticia sociopolítica, cultural, económica, religiosa, o porque padecemos una enfermedad o necesidades, por ser fieles al evangelio, eso es vivir en santidad. Cada vez que practicamos nuestra paciencia en el hogar, la familia, nuestra comunidad de fe, con nuestros superiores o súbditos, compañeros de trabajo, con nuestros pastores y diferentes sistemas que nos rodean, con la gracia de Dios, eso es vivir en santidad. Cuando vemos las injusticias cometidas, sobre todo con los más pobres, marginados vulnerables, y luchamos con todo nuestro ser para que llegue a ellos la misericordia, manifestada en la justicia, y el Reino de Dios, eso es vivir en santidad. El arzobispo Oscar Romero, sumándose a estas luchas, decía: “Queremos un pueblo santo, queremos una política que de veras camine en el bienestar de nuestro pueblo y de nuestros pobres”

Cada vez que practicamos la compasión con aquellos que se equivocan, que andan extraviados, aquellos que nos ofenden, eso es vivir en santidad. Cada vez que vivimos en paz interior y luchamos por promover esa paz del corazón en todos nuestros ambientes, eso es vivir en santidad. Cuando somos perseguidos por defender el bien común, especialmente cuando los intereses de los más poderosos se quieren imponer sobre los derechos de los más vulnerables, eso es vivir en santidad. Cuando nos levantan falso testimonios, cuando nos insultan por defender la causa del Evangelio, cuando sufrimos persecución, incluso dentro de la misma Iglesia, eso se llama vivir en santidad. Cualquier circunstancia que se aplique en tu vivencia diaria de fe de las arribas mencionadas, es la señal divina de que vives en santidad.

El mundo nos dice que la felicidad está en obtener el “éxito” en este mundo, lo cual consiste en tener suficiente dinero—cueste lo que cueste—para comprar una bonita casa y el mejor auto posible, usar ropa de Buena marca, comer bien, viajar y divertirse hasta más no poder...

Pero Jesús nos enseña que, para ser felices, tenemos que ser sencillos, superar las dificultades que se nos presentan confiando siempre en Dios, ser limpios de corazón, trabajar por la paz, ser promotores de justicia y soportar las injurias, persecuciones y las calumnias a causa de nuestra fe en él.
