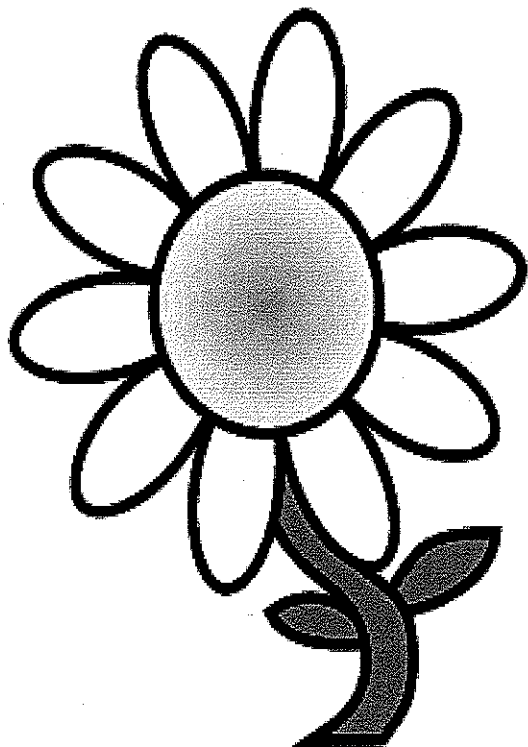

From the Desk of Father Kevin

Valuing “Doubt” and Thomas

I like the “Thomas” in today’s gospel. Most people see him as a “disciple who dropped the ball” of discipleship. Most people put him down by calling him a “doubting Thomas” (assuming that the other disciples never doubted. If they never doubted, why were they behind “locked doors” when the Risen Lord came into their midst?). Thomas is “put down” because the struggle we all have with doubt is uncomfortable. We, of course, like certitude. We think that having “faith” is being consciously aware of everything God is doing and will do for us. Supposedly, we know the PLAN. We have banned the “energy of doubt” from our lives because “we know”! I think this is an illusion and NOT generally how most, if not all of us, come to faith.

The fact is that we “come to faith”. We don’t “get” faith ~ in the sense of possessing and controlling it. We don’t control the process by which the gift is received. Coming to faith requires a humble openness and an honest listening to our lives. This means we give a rigorous attention to our feelings and our thoughts as we experience our lives unfolding. God relates to us as we process “reality” ~ in fact God IS the “ultimate reality”.

I see Thomas as a rigorous questioner. He wasn’t going to buy into a “passing fad”. At the same time, he was a risk taker when it came to commitment ~ but the risk would be taken on his terms, not from the social pressure of other disciples.

The monk from St. John’s Abbey (Collegeville), Matthew Luft, OSB said it this way:

Perhaps while all the other apostles were cowering in fear, he was out in the streets telling the Good News. Perhaps he was at the tomb, trying to put the pieces together. Perhaps he went to check in on Mary, the Mother of Jesus, or one of Jesus’ other friends. Thomas may not have fully understood what was happening, but perhaps he decided he needed to try to do something rather than stay behind the locked doors. But Thomas was not going to take their word for it; he needed to experience the risen Christ himself. After all, don’t we do that? We hear about how God has worked in other people’s lives, but until we are the recipients of a miracle ... or we have felt a warm presence, or we have seen the white tunnel ~ we are a bit skeptical. We, too, doubt.

Thomas, just like the other ten disciples, should be revered by the Christian community as a man of deep prayer and deep belief. They all inspired others to belief. Their mere presence or shadow brought others to Christ.

I especially relate to Thomas, because his “coming to faith” is like mine and like so many others I have known. For me, Thomas “tells it like it is!”

When wrapped up in jobs, technology, and judging others daily, we stifle the goodness of our very own soul. We experience earth differently and we are not made to be part of it forever. This is why the Resurrection of Christ Jesus is the GREATEST celebration which is shared at every single Holy Mass. Every day has daybreak as that Easter morning when the apostles didn't understand the magnitude of what happened. The amazing part is we can choose to celebrate this EVERY single morning, our eyes open.

God is the goodness of the world. Through our baptism we are welcome to this Christian life. I choose to live a Christian life of saying yes to God. Easter morning and every morning are a resurrection of our soul, knowing that Jesus was able to suffer an extreme human death and still defeat eternal death ~ we are invited at every Mass to do the same. We are not all-knowing as God is, but we can be all-loving to every single human being we encounter as Christ Jesus was. It is the Jubilee Year of Mercy ~ loving others unconditionally is what God created us to do; by our baptism, it is what God sent us to do. Jesus is our teacher; he taught us to love mercifully. Use his example to experience Easter morning goodness every day.

Our New Archbishop Has Been Announced!



On Holy Thursday, March 24, Pope Francis formally named Archbishop Bernard A. Hebda as the new leader of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis.

Archbishop-Designate Hebda has been serving as Apostolic Administrator of the Archdiocese since June 15, 2015. During that time, he has also been serving the Archdiocese of Newark, New Jersey, as Coadjutor Archbishop, and was scheduled to replace Archbishop John J. Myers when he is expected to retire in July.

In addition to serving the Archdioceses of Newark and Saint Paul and Minneapolis, he was Bishop of the Diocese of Gaylord, Michigan and has served at the Vatican and in parishes in his hometown of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Archbishop-Designate Hebda's Installation Mass is scheduled for 2 pm, Fri., May 13, the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima, at the Cathedral of Saint Paul.

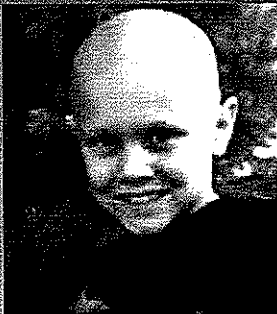

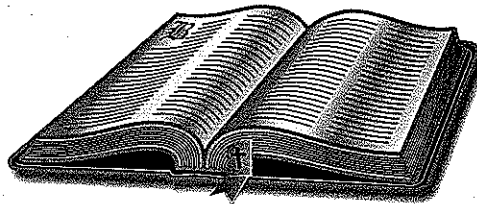

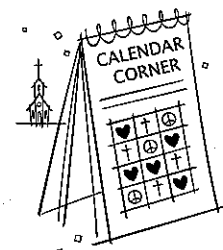
