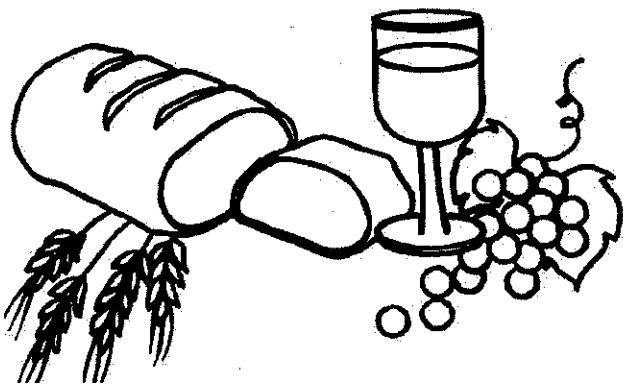

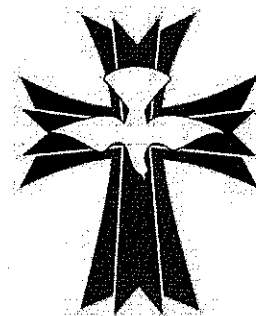

From the Desk of Father Dave

On White Dresses and Ties

May 1st is a great day for our parish. We are coming off the celebration of Confirmation this weekend at Divine Mercy Church in Faribault. They celebrated this sacrament after being sent forth from this community last Sunday. Today we celebrate 1st communion in our churches. The students dress up in order to show reverence. Dresses and ties bring these blessed children another way to make this day special. For the first time in a long time, none of the students are choosing to celebrate at St. Scholastica. All nine have some connection to the St. John's site. They do, however, belong to all of us. We do not make this sacrament in isolation. If possible, we celebrate with the regular praying community. I want each and every one of us to pray for them. We are connected to them in prayer, even if we don't know them personally. My challenge to you is to congratulate them individually in order to help the children realize the importance of this day.

The sacrament of Holy Communion is a unifying sacrament. The candidates are invited to share at the table. They have completed the second sacrament of initiation. This moves them along their journey of faith. Our Church is richer because these young people have made this step. We claim them at baptism, but we gratefully share even more of the mystery with them in the beautiful sacrament of the Eucharist. The ultimate giving of his body and blood make us realize we have a living sacrifice. God is real flesh and blood and helps us be a greater part of our community.

May the actions taken by these second graders be an inspiration to us. Even though these little ones are dependent on us, they can also be our teacher. Their "Amen" when receiving the Eucharist renews within us the commitment they are making today. May we then try and make Mass a weekly habit. We want the parents to make sure their little ones go every week. If we go every week, we will be there to support the students. Wouldn't the world be a better place if we all put God first by being a praying part of the community? Dresses and ties will fade, but the real gift given to these children today is eternal life.

What Are the Benefits of Rain Gardens?

Whether you live in the city or along a lake or river, managing storm water runoff is important. Rooftops, roads, driveways, and sidewalks are hard surfaces that prevent rainwater and melting snow from reaching the soil and soaking into the ground. These hard surfaces also tend to collect nutrient-rich yard and pet debris, oil and radiator fluid from autos, and other debris and pollutants.

During a rain event or snow melt, fast-moving runoff washes the nutrient-rich debris and other harmful pollutants away, often directly into lakes, rivers, and wetlands. The greater amount and increased speed of water flowing off hard surfaces can erode soil and carry it into our surface waters. In the summer, runoff is often warmed as it flows over hard surfaces. If the warm runoff enters lakes and rivers directly, it can affect aquatic life.

A rain garden is one way to address all of these problems. Rain gardens are designed to collect stormwater runoff, preventing the runoff from flowing directly into lakes, rivers, and wetlands. They allow runoff to soak into the soil, filtering out pollutants before entering the groundwater. Rain gardens also allow sediments to settle and plants to absorb nutrients. ~ *U of M Extension Office*

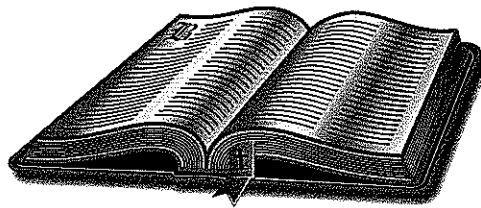

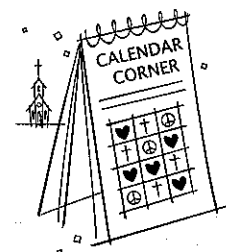
