Fourth Sunday of Easter B

On this, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, we continue our Easter celebration, which will carry on until Pentecost.

We celebrate this weekend what is referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday, and focus in a special way on vocations to ministry among God's people.

The First Reading shows Peter and John boldly sharing the good news of Jesus' resurrection, at some considerable risk to their own safety; the Second Reading reminds us of our relationship with God, a relationship of child to parent; and the Gospel reading has Jesus speaking in terms of shepherding.
