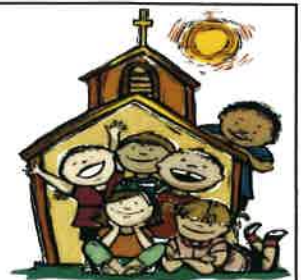

Seventeenth Sunday of Ordinary Time B

Sometimes we get the impression that the things Jesus did were his own invention, things **he** did for the first time. But much of the significance of things that Jesus did in his ministry flows from connections with things that happened in the Jewish scriptures; Jesus' actions struck a chord in those who knew and loved the Old Testament. Today we have side by side a Gospel Reading from John and a First Reading from the Old Testament book of Second Kings, two stories that sound remarkably similar. And this Gospel story shows up six times in the four Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, so it must be pretty important.

Also interesting is the fact that the Gospel of John never gives us an account of the Last Supper, and yet it is likely the strongest Eucharistic Gospel we have. Today's Gospel Reading leads us into John's powerful teachings on the Eucharist over the next six weeks.

E questa storia evangelica si presenta sei volte sei volte nei quattro Vangeli di Matteo, Marco, Luca e Giovanni, quindi deve essere molto importante.

Interessante anche il fatto che il Vangelo di Giovanni non ci dà mai un resoconto dell'ultima cena, ma è probabilmente il più forte Vangelo eucaristico che abbiamo. La Lettura del Vangelo di oggi ci porta nei potenti insegnamenti di Giovanni sull'Eucarista nelle prossime sei settimane.
