When I was a child growing up in New Iberia, summers usually never included a vacation because we were poor and because Momma didn't drive, day trips never happened. Sometimes, we went to Carnival Beach (remember that – right off of I-49) and thought we had died and went to heaven. Sometimes, we would spend a week at my Uncle Numa's camp in Cypremore Point surrounded by aunts and uncles and a "gajillion" cousins. While vacations were infrequent, every summer saw the canning of corn, purple hull peas and okra. The dreaded of the three was corn, but we kids were so grateful to have macque choux on our Thanksgiving and Christmas plates. The kids were relegated to cleaning the corn and if you think I am particular, my Momma was ten times worse. Every cob of corn had to be free of any silk before Momma cut it. She didn't allow us to cut the corn off the cob because she had her method. She would go once around the corn cob just cutting the top of each kernel, then a second time, then with the back of the knife, one more time to get all of the milk out. There was never a piece of the cob that made it into her pot. My favorite of the three was the purple hull peas. That was fun to open each pod and run my finger along the open pod to get every pea there was. That could be done while watching T.V. so it was less boring. Okra was basically just Momma cutting since she wanted all her okra pieces to be the same size. I was usually the only one with her when she did her okra because it was easy.

Laura, my housekeeper, is now canning okra for the Bishop's freezer and my freezer. As my freezer fills with the beautifully blanched okra, my mind goes to those summers in New Iberia when Momma was still alive and times seemed less complicated. My dear friends, use the summer's slower pace to remember with gratitude the past that shaped and formed us and let's be grateful even for the lessons that were hard to endure. "Everything is grace," as St. Therese of the Little Flower once said, "Everything is grace!"
