29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Background:

Having challenged the chief priests and elders with his stories, the prophet Jesus now addresses the Pharisees and Herodians, both of whom were sincerely trying to recall their fellow-Jews to a more authentic living of the covenant that God had made with their ancestors, a situation complicated by the Romans' complete domination of their country. How do we live in the tension between the very real demands of our society and still maintain our allegiance to the God's kingdom/reign?

**Discussion Questions:**

1. Describe a time when you felt a conflict between expectations and values at work or with family and friends and your relationship with Jesus.
2. Discernment can be a difficult process. Who has been your best adviser as you attempt to discern God's call for you? Why?
3. During the Vietnam War some Catholics enlisted because they believed in the rightness of that cause; others sought status as conscientious objectors. Are you comfortable with that kind of diversity?
4. As Paul says, conviction comes through the power of the Holy Spirit within us. When have you felt empowered by the Spirit in the midst of a real challenge?

**How You, Your Friends, and Family  
can Protect Your Right to Vote:**

Because of Covid-19, your polling location might change. Avoid the long lines and risk of infection by utilizing your right to Vote by Mail with an Absentee Ballot. Complete your ballot at home and either take it to your local **Board of Elections** or mail it early enough that it is postmarked no later than November 2. DO not take your Absentee Ballot to your local polling station. Use the Track My Ballot button to both track your Absentee Ballot Application and your Ballot to make sure it was counted. It's another reason to vote early.
