

# Mass to Celebrate St. Andrew's 50 Years

St. Andrew's Catholic Church, Superior Avenue N. E. and E. 51st Street, will observe the golden jubilee anniversary of its founding tomorrow with a solemn pontifical mass at 10 a.m. by Archbishop Edward F. Hoban.

Other outstanding Catholic events of the day include the opening of five outdoor shrines, the silver jubilee anniversary of a Cleveland priest, and first solemn masses for two newly-ordained priests.

At the mass in St. Andrew's Church, Archbishop Hoban will use a gold chalice wrought by priests of the Montserrat Benedictine Abbey in Barcelona, Spain. The chalice was consecrated in Rome by Pope Pius XII and used by him for the first time March 19. Archbishop Hoban will be the first to use it since that occasion. Abbot Stanislaus Gmuca, O. S. B., first abbot of St. Andrew's Abbey here and now pastor of St. Matthias' Church in Natrona, Pa., will preach.

**Native Sons to Aid**  
Native sons of the parish now in the priesthood will assist the archbishop. They include the Rev. Joseph Elias, pastor of St. Andrew's Church, Sheffield; the Rev. Michael Jasko, O. S. B., assistant at St. Benedict's Church, Cleveland; the Rev. Gilbert Stopko, O. S. B., pastor of Our Lady of Sorrow Church, Put in Bay; and the Rev. Aloysius Janco, O. S. B., and Rev. Thomas Podobnik, O. S. B., both of St. Andrew's Abbey.

At a dinner in Hotel Manger at 6 p.m., Auxiliary Bishop Floyd L. Begin and Congressman Michael A. Feighan will speak. The toastmaster will be the Rev. George Luba, O. S. B., of St. Andrew's Abbey and a former pastor of St. Andrew's Church.

Gov. Frank J. Lausche will attend the jubilee mass, and Mayor Anthony J. Celebrezze will give the greeting at the banquet.

# 16 Churches to Observe Easter Rites

## Lenten Period Ending for the Orthodox

Easter Sunday, according to the ecclesiastical calendar of the Eastern Orthodox Church, will be observed tomorrow in 16 Orthodox Churches of Greater Cleveland.

Good Friday, celebrated yesterday, was a solemn observance for the 90,000 members of these churches in the metropolitan community. In observance of the supreme sacrifice, the divine liturgy is not offered on Good Friday.

The service of lamentations was chanted last night by the choirs of the churches with the congregations holding lighted candles.

This service expresses the sorrow of Christians that the Lord has died and the expectation of His quick and life-giving resurrection.

**Street Procession**  
On the Southwest Side of Cleveland last night the Orthodox congregations of Annunciation Greek Church, St. George Syrian Church and St. Vladimir's Ukrainian Church united in a colorful procession which traversed the blocks between W. 14th and W. 11th Streets.

Each church had in the procession its hier richly decorated with Easter lilies. At intervals the clergy paused to offer prayers.

Tonight at midnight all the lights in the churches will be extinguished and the hymn "Behold the Dawn and Rise of Day" will be chanted in total darkness.

After this hymn the royal gates of the iconostasion are opened and the priests emerge with lighted candles chanting: "Come ye, take light from the light that never wanes, come glorify the Christ risen from the dead."

At this point the light is distributed to candles in the hands of the congregation. Then, at the high point of the service, the hymn of "Christos Anesti" (Christ is Risen) is chanted. The divine liturgy of St. John Chrysostom is celebrated.

These services will be held during the weekend at Albanian, Greek, Syrian, Serbian, Romanian and Russian-Orthodox Churches of Greater Cleveland.

## End East Sparta Clay Plant Tieup

CANTON, O., May 4—A wildcat strike by 1,100 workers at the U. S. Ceramic Tile Co. plant at nearby East Sparta ended today after Stark County Common Pleas Judge Paul G. Weber issued an injunction, preventing interference with workers.

The strikers returned after hearing officials of the International Gas and Ceramic Workers Union (AFL-CIO) disavow the walkout.

The company and the union recently agreed to a new contract calling for a 9-cent package settlement which featured the first pension program in the clay industry.

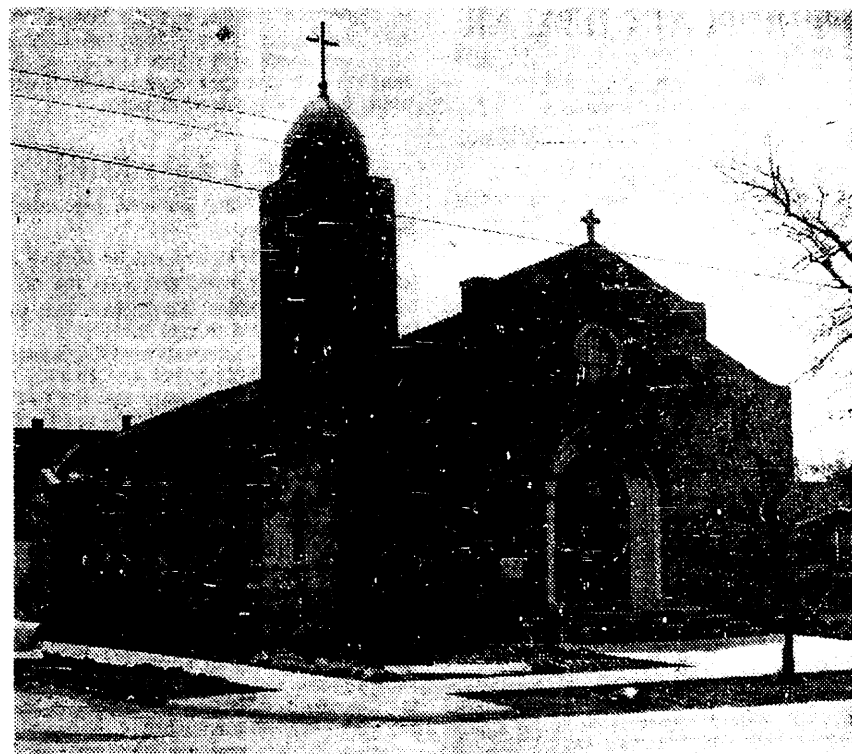

# Rabbi to Talk on Spiritual History

UNDER the title "Battles of the Spirit That Have Kept Judaism Alive," Rabbi Alan S. Green of Temple Emanu El, 2200 South Green Road, South Euclid, will give a series of addresses tracing the spiritual history of the Jews during May on Friday evenings at 8:30 in the temple.

His talks will emphasize how intellectual and religious controversies of earnest although often bitterly opposed men kept Judaism vital.

The presentations will be divided chronologically into ancient, medieval and modern times and deal with these subjects: "Prophecy vs. Priest," "Philosophy vs. Mystery," "Hasis vs. Misnagid" and "Torah True vs. Progressive."

The annual congregation meeting of Temple-on-the-Heights will be held at 10 a.m. tomorrow. Members of the temple, now in its 90th year, will hear the annual message of Rabbi Rudolph M. Rosenthal, spiritual leader, and elect officers and trustees.

The meeting coincides with Rabbi Rosenthal's 50th birthday. The congregation will note the occasion and honor him.

On May 16, Rabbi Armond E. Cohen will confirm his 22nd class since he became spiritual leader of Park Synagogue, 3325 Euclid Heights Boulevard, Cleveland Heights, more than a score of years ago.

There are 56 members in the present class, and their confirmation will take place on the first day of the Feast of First Fruits.

Dr. Mark C. Schimmer, superintendent of the Cleveland public schools, will speak at the Temple tomorrow morning. He will address the congregation on "Major Problems in Education."

The Civil Aeronautics Board said it issued a special two-page memorandum, April 6, declaring that "where duplicate facilities are provided that are intended for segregated use, the areas involved will be excluded" from federal aid.

The agency announced the policy after it had been disclosed by Rep. Adam Clayton Powell, Negro Democrat from New York. Powell had said he understood it meant that federal funds would be denied any airports in which there are segregated facilities.

But a CAA spokesman said it merely meant that no federal aid would be granted for segregated facilities, including separate waiting rooms, dining rooms, kitchens and similar installations. Aid would be available for other projects at airports with such facilities.

WASHINGTON, May 4 (UP)—The government, striking a new blow at racial discrimination, announced today it will deny federal funds for construction of segregated rest rooms, dining rooms and other facilities at airports.
