St. Adalbert to Dedicate New School

A new Catholic school on Cleveland's Southeast Side will be dedicated tomorrow by St. Adalbert Parish.

The two-story \$200,000 building stands next door to the church at 2345 E. 83d Street. Built by the R. P. Carbone Co., it has eight classrooms, a kindergarten and two basement meeting rooms.

Facilities of St. Adalbert Parish were taken over last year by Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Parish. The latter, organized in 1922 for Negroes of the Catholic faith, had outgrown its quarters at 2350 E. 79th Street. Membership in St. Adalbert,

a Bohemian parish, had dwindled as the neighborhood changed.

PARISH CHILDREN will continue to attend the old Blessed Sacrament School, 2348 E. 79th Street, until June. The 275 pupils are taught by Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored People.

Auxiliary Bishop John F. Whealon will officiate at the dedication at 11 a.m. and at a pontifical low mass afterward in the church. His chaplains will be the Rev. Victor Pan-

ley, C.P.P.S., pastor of Our Lady of Good Counsel, and the Rev. Werner Verhoff, C.P.P.S., pastor of St. Edward Church.

The Very Rev. John Byrne, C.P.P.S., American provincial of the Precious Blood Order, will come from Dayton to preach.

A dinner in Fairfax Recreation Center across the street from the church will follow the mass. Msgr. Clarence E. Elwell, diocesan school superintendent, will speak.
