

St. Adalbert School Is Dedicated in Rain

The new St. Adalbert Catholic School on the Southeast Side was dedicated yesterday under a light spring rain. Auxiliary Bishop John F. Whealon blessed the two-story, brick building at 2345 E. 83rd Street.

"The rain reminds us," he said, "of the way the people in the Old Testament looked upon rain—as a sign of God's blessing and graces."

"The rain can be taken as a sign of the second spring of this parish," the bishop said. "The building of your first permanent school is a great step forward for St. Adalbert."

FACILITIES of St. Adalbert, a 79-year-old Bohemian parish, were put to new use last year when the diocese turned the parish over to the priests and parishoners of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament, established in 1922 for Negroes of the Catholic faith.

Neither parish ever had a permanent school. St. Adalbert's old frame school closed some years ago after parish membership dwindled and was torn down last summer to make room for the new \$200,000 building. Parish children will be moved there from the old Blessed Sacrament School, 2348 E. 79th Street, when classes resume in September.

Dedication of the new school for Negro children came on the day when the Roman Catholic Church raised to sainthood Martin de Porres, a Peruvian Negro. A large bouquet of yellow rosebuds stood in front of the statue of St. Martin in the church. A service in his honor was held at 5 p.m.

BISHOP WHEALON was celebrant of the pontifical low mass that followed the dedication. The Very Rev. John Byrne, C.P.P.S., American provincial of the Precious Blood fathers, who have charge of the parish, came from Dayton to preach the sermon.

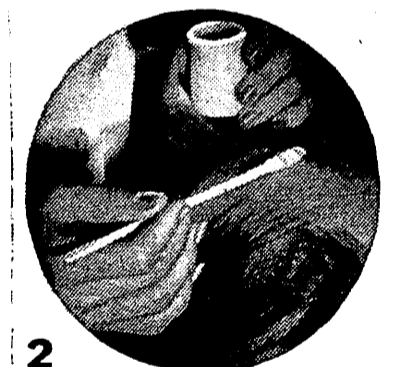

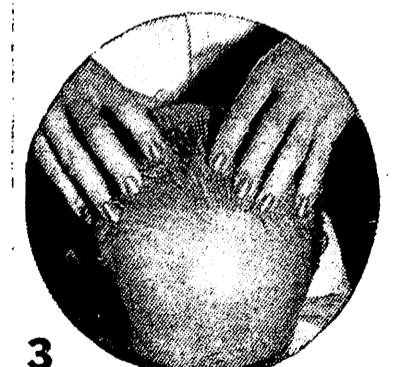
