

Ex-Lieutenant Given Robes of Monsignor

A one-time steel mill worker and army lieutenant in World War II was invested yesterday with the robes of a monsignor by Archbishop Edward F. Hoban.

The priest so honored was Msgr. Edward S. Hannon, pastor of Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church, 3381 Fulton Road S. W. The investiture ceremony took place before the noon mass, offered by Msgr. Hannon.

An overflow crowd of worshippers attended the mass. A large delegation of priests and friends of the pastor from his Youngstown days joined later at a dinner for the archbishop in the church hall.

"I have known Msgr. Hannon a long time," said Msgr. Francis P. Johns, director of the Diocesan Retreat House, in his sermon at Msgr. Hannon's mass. He hailed Msgr. Hannon for his "distinguished service to the church."

Both priests had been inspired by the zeal and personality of the late Msgr. John R. Kenney, then pastor of the Immaculate Conception Church in Youngstown.

"The bishop is the one and only teacher in the diocese. He is the divinely appointed public teacher. But the bishop cannot do all work by himself, and therefore he teaches priests to take his place among the people."

"The pastor is the bond that unites the parish with the bishop, and his is a great responsibility for the salvation of souls."

Msgr. Johns called Msgr. Hannon "a very successful pastor."

"He is talented, kindly and, above all, he is willing to be bothered," Msgr. Johns told the congregation.

Drawing a lesson from the courage displayed by the honored priest, the monsignor told his audience: "Fear God and nothing will daunt you. Courage must contain faith in God. Otherwise it is recklessness."

He lashed out at faint-hearted

ness, a phenomenon of modern times which "lies like a plague upon us."

Archbishop Hoban, in his dinner speech, commended Msgr. Hannon for his many kindnesses and charity to the priest's predecessor, the late Msgr. Stephen Wilson.

Msgr. Hannon has been pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church since Sept. 15, 1950. During his retirement, Msgr. Wilson made his home with the present pastor. He died last spring.

The archbishop also commended Msgr. Johns as a priest who is "not afraid to say what he thinks."

The Rev. Werner F. Verhoff was installed yesterday as pastor of St. Edward's Church, Woodland Avenue S. E. and E. 69th Street, by Msgr. Charles W. McDonough, pastor of Holy Name Church and dean of the Southeast Deanery. The installation was at the noon mass.

Father Verhoff, former assistant at Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Church, succeeds the Rev. Melchior Lochtefeld, who served 14 years at St. Edward's and the six previous years at Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament.

On completion of 20 years of apostolate among Negro Catholics here, Father Lochtefeld was assigned as pastor of St. Michael's Church, at Kalida, in Putnam County, O.

Deacon and subdeacon at the installation were, respectively, the Rev. David Dougherty, assistant at St. Edward's and the Rev. Vincent Hoying of St. Charles' Seminary, Carthage, O.

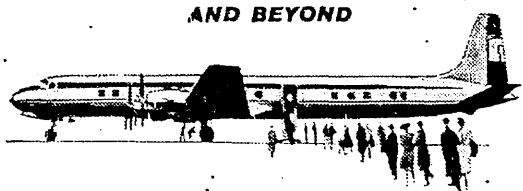
