

# New Catholic Parish Buys Site in Eastlake

THE NEW Catholic parish of St. Justin Martyr in Eastlake has purchased a site for its future church and school. Work was begun this week to remodel a house on the property at 35739 Stevens Boulevard as a parish administration center.

The six-room ranch-style house will be used for offices and for living quarters for the pastor, the Rev. Victor M. Lambur. An addition now under construction will contain a small chapel with seating capacity of 40. It will be used for daily mass.

SUNDAY MASSES are held at 8 and 10 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. in Eastlake's North High School. St. Justin has purchased 600 chairs for use of parishioners at services.

Organization of parish societies has begun. Nominating committees of the Holy Name Society and Altar Society will meet next month.

The parish site is a 12½-acre parcel with 3,180 feet

frontage. Dept is 396 feet. Building plans are indefinite, but a fund drive will probably be held this fall.

St. Justin is one of three new parishes established by Archbishop Edward F. Hoban last month. The other two — St. Joan of Arc in Chagrin Falls and St. Thomas the Apostle in Sheffield Lake — previously were missions. They have sites on which some construction has taken place.

# St. Adalbert Parish to Hold Census

Members of the Legion of Mary will begin ringing doorbells in the Woodland Avenue-Buckeye Road S. E. area next Saturday.

Legionnaires from all parts of the county will be conducting a census for St. Adalbert Catholic Church. At the same time they will invite the residents to an open house to be held Sunday, Aug. 26, at the church and school on 83d Street north of Woodland.

ST. ADALBERT is anxious to have its neighbors see the new \$300,000 school, which will open for the first time in September. The eight-room school, completed last spring, is one of the largest buildings completed in the area in some time.

The church is also new to its parishioners. The diocese last year turned over St. Adalbert, established in 1883 for Bohemian families who have now moved away, to the priests and parishioners of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Church, which had been at 2350 E. 79th Street since its founding in 1922.

THE OLD SCHOOL at St. Adalbert was torn down shortly after the transfer. The 275 pupils continued studying in Blessed Sacrament School while the new building was erected. The site on E. 79th is expected to be sold shortly.

Warren Scott, head of the Legion unit at St. Adalbert, is working with George V. Kieski, president of the Cleveland Comitium of the Legion, in organizing "Operation Welcome." The Legionnaires expect it will take four or five Saturdays to complete their task of calling on all homes within the parish.

THE ST. ADALBERT unit was started five years ago. Its spiritual director is the Rev. Leonard Sudhoff, C.P.P.S., the pastor. Priests of the Precious Blood Order have had charge of this parish and of neighboring St. Edward since the mid 1930s.

The school is taught by Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored People.

# Clevelander to Be Ordained Priest in Austria

A Cleveland Jesuit, the Rev. John E. Dister, will be ordained to the priesthood in ceremonies Thursday in Innsbruck, Austria.

Bishop Paul Rusch will officiate at the ordination in the church of the university, where the Clevelander has been studying theology the last three years.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Arthur C. Dister, 2065 Lincoln Avenue, Lakewood, and his sister, Miss Rosemary Dister, left Wednesday to fly to Austria.

Father Dister will offer his first mass July 29 in Immaculate Conception Church in Innsbruck. A graduate of St Ignatius High School, he entered the Society of Jesus in 1949. He taught in Cincinnati before going to Austria.

# Greek Orthodox Choirs to Meet

Choirs from 50 Greek Orthodox churches in a six-state area will assemble here Thursday through Sunday for their Sixth Diocesan Choir Convention.

Sessions will be held in Hotel Sheraton-Cleveland. Delegates are to form a 350-voice choir for a special church service at 10 a.m. Sunday in the hotel ballroom at which Bishop Theodosios Sideris of Pittsburgh will officiate, assisted by local Greek Orthodox clergy.

The three Greek Orthodox churches here will close that Sunday so that parishioners may attend the convention service.
