London Music Critic Points to Late Artist's Mastery.

LONDON .- There are many people who considered Busoni the greatest of living pianists, and whether they vere right or not, his death re moves a formidable rival from the fath of those who have claims to that title, particularly if his piano playing is regarded, not merely from the point of view of mastery of the instrument, but rather as the

from the point of view of mastery of the instrument, but rather as the expression of an original and dominating musical personality.

With all his astonishing gifts, Busoni never acquired that hold over the general public in the widest sense which others not equally gifted succeeded in obtaining. The explanation is not too creditable to the age we live in. He was too uncompromising in the pursuit of his artistic ideals. He was too intellectual a musician to be satisfied with the pursuit of mere beauty in his interpretations—which, after all, is what the largest public wants. His musical personality was strangely complex. The title of postileal interpreter cannot be denied to him; his playing of music so diverse as that of Bach and Liszt was instinct with imaginative force. He did in a sense create the music he was playing, without violence to the composer. He had an impulsive temperament. His temperamental impulse, however, seems aften to have been too much controlled by the unusual strength of his analytical powers. Latterly his Chopin playing, for instance, left a great portion of his audience completely cold.
