And His mercy is on those who fear Him from generation to generation.

and the rich He has sent empty away. He has helped Israel, his servant,
in remembrance of his mercy; as He promised to our fathers,

All stand and make the Sign of the Cross at "God."





All bow during the mention of the Holy Trinity
