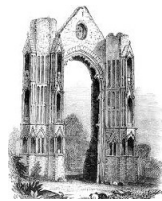

The Collect for Purity

One of the glories of the Anglican tradition, now restored to the Catholic Church and preserved in *Divine Worship: The Missal*, consists in those prayers called *collects*, so named because they gather together or “collect” the focused petitions appointed for the Sundays and holy days of the liturgical year. The collects of the Anglican Prayer Book are, for the most part, superb English translations of the ancient Roman orations that come down to us from the Sacramentaries of three early popes: Leo I (440-461), Gelasius (492-496), and Gregory the Great (590-604). First adapted in the sixteenth-century by Thomas Cranmer, the limpid rolling periods of these English collects manage to capture much of the concision, stylistic richness, emotional range, and theological nuance of the Latin originals.

A fine example is the prayer that opens Holy Mass celebrated according to the Ordinarate use of the Roman Rite, the so-called Collect for Purity:

(1) ALMIGHTY God, (2) unto whom all hearts be open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: (3) cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit, (4) that we may perfectly love thee, and worthily magnify thy holy Name; (5) through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Characteristic of the form and style of the ancient Latin collects, this prayer is structured thus: (1) the *address*, typically, with but a few exceptions, an invocation of God the Father; (2) the *acknowledgment*, designating the point of doctrine or quality of God relevant to the request being made; (3) the *petition*, asking God's special mercies and graces for the faithful, (4) the *aspiration*, often eschatological in character, specifying the end for which we make our petition; and (5) the *pleading*, whereby we offer the prayer through Jesus Christ, our Mediator and Advocate by Whom we approach the Father in the Holy Spirit.

Taken from the Sarum Missal, the Collect for Purity was originally a vesting prayer said by the priest and his servers before Mass. But in the Anglican Eucharist it takes the place of the Prayers at the Foot of the Altar in the traditional Roman Rite and serves as a preparatory invocation offered to God by the celebrant on behalf of the people in solemn supplication of the grace of the Holy Ghost necessary to participate in the Holy Sacrifice.
