Dear Sacred Heart Family,

This Sunday we celebrate “World Mission Sunday.” A special 2<sup>nd</sup> collection is taken up this Sunday for an organization called the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. This Society is run by the Vatican to help with the over 1,000 mission dioceses around the world, mostly in Africa and Asia. These dioceses are in areas where there are very few Catholics or even Christians, but where the Church is helping to bring the love of Jesus Christ into the society. This is done through clinics caring for the sick and dying, orphanages providing a place of safety and shelter, schools offering education from kindergarten through high school. Since very few Catholics are present in these dioceses, and those that live there are often very poor, there are very few funds from the local faithful to pay for these efforts. But the Society for the Propagation of the Faith supplies money to pay for these ministries, and thus allows Christ’s love to be present in these communities, some of which are very, very poor.

The money from our collection also helps men from these dioceses attend the seminary. The Society of the Propagation of the Faith runs a seminary in Rome where men from these mission dioceses from all over the world study. This seminary is right next door to the where I studied in Rome and I got to know some of these men. They were dedicated and eager to get back home to spread the love and Good News of Jesus Christ, not just to fellow Catholics, but more importantly to so many who did not know who Jesus was.

This World Mission Sunday reminds us that we can help, through our prayers and donations, in spreading the Gospel in far off places around the world, thus fulfilling Jesus’ command: “*Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations...*” This Sunday also reminds us that, as Pope Francis stated, “*The Church is missionary by nature; otherwise, she would no longer be the Church of Christ, but one group among many others that soon end up serving their purpose and passing away... Through the Church, Christ continues his mission as the Good Samaritan, caring for the bleeding wounds of humanity, and as Good Shepherd, constantly seeking out those who wander along winding paths that lead nowhere.*”

As we celebrate World Mission Sunday, I hope we can all ask the Lord to reveal to us where men and women are wounded in our community, where they are wandering along paths that lead to nowhere, and thus inspire us to bring Him and His Love to them.
