HOW TO USE THE AED...that is located in church and also in the Parish Center will be offered in a short presentation with opportunity to ask questions at Coffee and Rolls this morning. Recently there was an occasion when the AED could have and perhaps should have been used but was not. Emergency personnel were called. But it takes time for them to arrive. Time that might make a difference. An AED, or automated external defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet easy-to-use, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.
