Anything. Before we go back inside, I tell him to 'drop it'. And he has to leave it outside, or at least in the garage. He cannot bring it into the house. At first, he did not seem to understand, but over time (and consistent practice) he has come to expect it and obeys readily.

In our day to day living, we pick stuff up and carry it around with us... sometimes we even play with it. Disappointments, anxieties, regrets, prejudices... lots of stuff. Wouldn't it be so handy if we could just 'drop it' and go forward with life? Many times, we carry this stuff around for years without even realizing it. But our Lord makes it clear. We have to discard all that keeps us from his love and mercy before

we can enter into his life... both here on earth and for eternity. Ask him for the grace to 'drop' anything that is keeping you from entering into his goodness.

Nine Month Novena

A Baby's life:

- By the end of the first month, a baby is about 1/4-inch-long – smaller than a grain of rice.
- At about 6 weeks, your baby's heart beat can usually be detected.
- By the end of the second month, a baby is about 1 inch long and weighs about 1/30 of an ounce
- After the 8th week, a baby is called a fetus instead of an embryo.
- By the end of the third month, your baby is fully formed. All the organs and limbs (extremities) are present and will continue to develop in order to become functional. The baby's circulatory and urinary systems are also working, and the liver produces bile.
- At the end of the third month, your baby is about 4 inches long and weighs about 1 ounce.
