Lent Is Upon Us

This year, according to the directions of the United States Conference of Bishops, **we will receive ashes by sprinkling** rather than having them placed on our foreheads. This is a traditional European form of distributing ashes on Ash Wednesday, that has been adopted this year as a caution against the spread of viruses.

On a happier note, **a meal will be shared after the Ash Wednesday Mass.**

What are you going to “do” or “not do” for Lent this year?

Everyone is called to prayer, fasting and almsgiving, and there is a plethora of ways to do that.

At least with regard to prayer, may I make some suggestions? I often say that consistency is more important than quantity when it comes to prayer. Having said that, here’s a challenge to see what level you are willing to offer:

Novice Level

Pray the *Angelus* 6:00 am/12:00 pm/6:00 pm every day. Plus, observe Fasting and Abstinence on Fridays and days of obligation.

Moderate Catholic Level

Same as Novice Level, plus, pray the *Apostles’ Creed* at noon and *Act of Contrition* at night.

Mature Catholic Level

Same as Moderate Catholic, plus, pray a rosary or go to Mass every day.

Prayer Ninja Level

Same as Mature Catholic, plus, do a media fast: (Unless required for work or school...no internet, no TV, no video games...nothing. Read a book or something instead.)

Prayer Ninja Warrior Level

Same as Prayer Ninja, plus, pray the “*Auxilium Christianorum*” (Help of Christians) prayers every day. These prayers can be downloaded at Auxiliumchristianorum.org or onto your mobile device from your App Store. FREE!
