

CATHOLIC RELIGIOUS AWARD AWARENESS



Many religious groups have special awards for Boy Scouts of their faith. Religious recognition programs are created by religious groups to encourage boys to grow stronger in their faith. A boy works with his own family and religious leaders to complete the requirements for these awards. Booklets and information for boys of Protestant faiths, Jewish and some Eastern religions can be purchased in the Council Shop. Booklets for the Catholic faith can be purchased in the Council Shop as well as the Office of Catholic Youth Ministry. A troop with boys of different religions may work together on activities that are similar and then meet individually with their priest, minister or rabbi to complete the award.

Highlighted here are the Catholic Religious Awards available for Boy Scouts in Rhode Island

LIGHT OF CHRIST - Tiger Cub and Wolf Cub Scouts

Scout-Parent program in the family environment. Designed to help scout develop a friendship with Jesus; enhances parish CCD programs.

Requirements must be completed before the start of the third grade.

Application form in the back of the scout's Activity Book must be signed by the pastor, and sent to the Diocesan Office of Catholic Youth Ministry at the address below.

Five steps in the program; one-two months to complete. Can be started any time of the year.

Awarded in the parish preferably at Mass, usually on Scout Sunday.

PARVULI DEI - Designed for Bear Cub Scouts, and Webelos

Scout-Parent program in the family environment. Any Cub Scout may earn the emblem.

At the completion of the program, he must have been registered for at least three months.

Application form in the back of the scout's Activity Book must be signed by the pastor, and sent to the Diocesan Office of Catholic Youth Ministry at the address below.

Five steps in the program; one-two months to complete.

Can be started any time of the year.

Awarded in the parish preferably at Mass, usually on Scout Sunday.

Boy Scouts: seventh and eighth graders: ages 12-14

Conducted by a religious emblems counselor, usually 7 or 8 sessions; three-six months to complete.

Subject is sacraments, complements most parish CCD programs.

Must be a registered Scout for one year (at time of completion).

Board of Review also required; conducted in January.

Emblems awarded by the Bishop, at the Cathedral in Providence, on Scout Sunday, March.

High School and College: ages 14 – 20

Conducted by a religious emblems counselor; seven or twelve session program; four-six months to complete.

Subjects include Being a Christian, Community, Service
