From the Pastor's Desk

But you, man of God, pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience and gentleness. Compete well for the faith. Lay hold of eternal life to which you were called. Keep the commandments without stain or reproach. (1 Tim. 6:11-12, 14)

These were the words of St. Paul when he addressed Timothy in his writing which is part of our second reading this 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

If we analyze St. Paul's letter to Timothy, he was actually mentoring Timothy to discipleship. He was saying that in order to be a disciple of Jesus, he should first strive to be a man of God and he enumerated the above traits on how this can be achieved. Well, that helped Timothy. He became a faithful disciple of Jesus and companion of St. Paul in his missionary journey.

Now, if we will take this admonition of St. Paul into our own journey, I think it is also helpful to us, especially in our pursuit to holiness and devotion to God. How faith, love, patience and gentleness can transform us into a better version of ourselves in our everyday life, especially in our relationship with God and our dealings with others.

When we are challenged by trials and struggles in life or with other personalities that we encounter every day, we will not easily be carried away with our impulsive reactions and negative thoughts because we try to be positive in our approach through the practice of those said virtues. We will be less self-centered and be sensitive of others, which is another virtue, especially in dealing with the poor people around us.

Actually, this was what the rich man was lacking in the gospel and what sent him to hell after he died. Not that he abused the poor man, Lazarus, when he was still alive and did wrong, but because of his self-centeredness and lack of sensitivity that led to doing nothing to alleviate the pain and suffering of Lazarus. That was his mistake. It was the sin of omission, the failure to do good that brought him to torment in the next life.

So truly, it is not enough to be good and holy. We also need to be sensitive to the people around us especially the poor, the sick and the needy and do whatever we can to make them better. After all, whatever we do to them, we do it to Christ, especially when it is done out of love. (Mt. 25: 40)

St. Mary parishioner and St. Joseph High School Freshman **Kathryn Huth** has been selected as one of the Top 300 Broadcom MASTERS in the 2019 Broadcom MASTERS®, a program of Society for Science and the Public. This honor places **Kathryn** among a select group of 300 MASTERS Middle School Innovators in National STEM Competition. She was named from over 2,300 entrants throughout the United States. Her project (“Solar Activity and Geomagnetism”) is a data analysis on the mass of a coronal mass ejection and any effect it might have on our geomagnetic atmosphere. The Top 300 Broadcom MASTERS were selected from a pool of 2,348 applicants from forty-seven states, DC, and two US territories. These competitors were evaluated by a panel of distinguished scientists, engineers and educators and judged on creativity and originality of their science fair project, their ability to engage in analysis of data and understanding of STEM principles as they relate to the real world. Each applicant was nominated to compete in the Broadcom MASTERS by placing among the top ten percent of middle school competitors at Society-affiliated regional and state science fairs. **Congratulations, Kathryn! †**

Evangelization

The Gloria - Over the previous couple of weeks, we have talked about sin, contrition, penance and mercy in the *Confiteor* and the *Kyrie*. Quite somber topics. They are set early in the Mass in order that we can properly reflect upon the times when we tried living apart and away from the Good, Good Father who so loves us. Now we switch our focus, from inward to outward, from me to God. The *Gloria* gets its

name from the first verse in Latin; “Gloria in excelsis Deo” or “Glory to God in the highest”. We know this as the Angels song to the shepherds announcing the birth of Jesus. This prayer was found to be written as early as 400 A.D. It was intended to be a prayer of praise outside of the Mass, but worked its way into the mass over several centuries because of its beauty and content. It is sometimes referred to as the great doxology. Doxology is just a fancy word meaning “words of praise”. The lesser doxology is one we use in prayer often as Catholics in the “Glory Be”. So, every time we acclaim “Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit...”, we are recalling the great *Gloria* we sing at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. It should also be noted that due to its outpouring of praise, it is intended to be sung at Mass and not just recited. To not sing it is comparable to going to a birthday party and just reciting the “Happy Birthday” song; it just doesn’t fit the occasion. The *Gloria* is a time to bring cheer and adoration back into our hearts after we have rightly groveled a bit in the penitential acts preceding it. However, during Advent and Lent, the church rightly omits it, not so much to “grovel” more, but to leave an emptiness that will be filled again on Christmas morning or at the end of the Lenten fast. †
