

giving us the reason for this celebration.





Fortitude—We have arrived at the last Sunday of Advent 2019. Only a few days remain before we cele-Evangelization brate the birth of our Lord and Savior on Christmas day. Over the past three weeks, we have reflected upon the Cardinal virtues of Prudence, Justice and Temperance and how to apply and practice them in our

lives. Fortitude is the virtue that gives us persistence (hanging in there) so that we can keep trying to practice the other virtues on a daily - or sometimes hourly basis. Fortitude is the courage we need to push ourselves to do or say the right thing when the world tells us that it is inconvenient or foolish. It is not easy to go against what is popular; we need strength and lots of it to be able to live a Christian life today. In the Gospel today, we see this virtue lived out in a heroic and exemplary way. Joseph is faced with this troublesome pregnancy that he cannot understand or explain. He should be lashing out in anger and seek the divorce that will end all his troubles. The world tells him, as it still tells us today, that we should give up and give in when faced with suffering and pain, both physical and emotional. But Joseph is told by the angel to "not be afraid". Fear of the unknown can be paralyzing, stopping us from walking forward in the hope of Christ. In reaction to fears, we can even give in to what we know is sinful because of our selfishness and pride. Joseph puts all these temptations aside and trusts in the radical and unbelievable words of scripture, "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means God is with us!" Joseph displays great courage by accepting this trial. His fortitude and perseverance continue as he takes his pregnant wife to Bethlehem for the census even when she is about to go into labor. Joseph gives up his livelihood and security when they flee to Egypt and years later again, packs up and returns to potentially face the same uncertainties that temporal loss of employment will bring. Let us look to St. Joseph as a model of strength and courage when we face the difficult and impossible. Practically, we need to teach our children that faith rooted in daily prayer helps to strengthen fortitude. Remind them to trust that doing the right thing may be hard, but God will provide the grace and ability to do it. It is okay to fail and fall, as long as we get up again and keep trying. We are loved because of who we are and not by what we do. "Be not afraid to open wide the doors for Christ!" Saint John Paul II 🕇
