## *From the Pastor's Desk*

On this Sunday within the Octave of Christmas, we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph who served as a model for all the families, especially in dealing with the day to day life. We may ask, "what was it like to live day in and day out in the household of St. Joseph? What was it like to have Jesus for a son, Mary as a wife and mother, and Joseph as a father and husband?" Their home would have certainly been a sacred place and a dwelling of true peace and unity. But it would have also been so much more.

Their family would have been, in numerous ways, just like our home. They would have talked, had fun, disagreed, worked, eaten their meals, dealt with problems, and encountered everything else that consists in a daily family life. Of course, the virtues of Jesus and Mary were perfect, and St. Joseph was truly a good and righteous man. Therefore, the overriding characteristic of their home would have been love.

But with that being said, their family would not have been exempted from daily work, challenges and pain of loss that most families face. For example, they would have encountered the death of a loved one. St. Joseph most likely passed away prior to Jesus' public ministry. They would have encountered gossip and misunderstanding from others. For example, our Blessed Mother was found with child that was conceived by the Holy Spirit. This would have been a topic of conversation among many friends for sure. They would have had to fulfill all daily chores, earn a living, put food on the table and go to the temple for holy days and special feasts. They would have lived a normal family life in every way.

This is significant because it reveals God's love for family life. The Father allowed His Divine Son to live this life and, as a result, elevated family life to a place within the Trinity. The holiness of the Holy Family reveals to us that every family is invited to share in God's divine life and to encounter ordinary daily life with grace and virtue.

Today I invite you to reflect upon your own family. How is your family doing? Do you have a good relationship with one another? If yes, keep it up and be grateful. But if some of you are struggling, feeling broken and deeply wounded, never allow yourself to be discouraged. Know that God wants to enter more deeply into your family life just as it is right now. He desires to give you strength and virtue to live as the Holy Family. Surrender yourself and your family this day, and invite the Triune God to make your family a holy family. Let this be our prayer:

***Lord, I offer to you this day all my joy and sorrow, my struggles and my blessings and in doing so, I offer to you my family. I offer every relationship, be it good or difficult, and I offer every challenge we face. Please come and sanctify my family, making it holy in imitation of your family in Nazareth.***

***Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!***

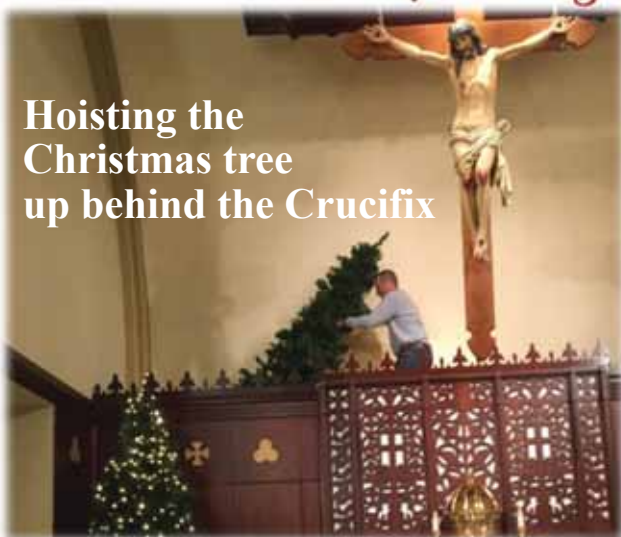

**Whole Families**—Just over seventy-two hours ago, we were all caught up in the tsunami of cookies and wrapping paper. Christmas was a day filled with family and memories, those being made and those being recalled. The church, in her wisdom, has declared the Sunday after Christ's birth to be called the feast of

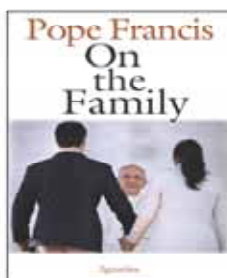
The Holy Family. It is a gift to us so that we can reflect and build upon those things that are of primary importance in our lives, those living right next to us under our own roof. God's purpose for family is to teach us daily what it means to love sacrificially. Our goal as a parent is simple, to get our children to heaven. So, let us look at the Holy Family as a model and see what indeed makes them "whole". They first centered their lives around Jesus. If we make Him the purpose and focus of our lives, then we cannot help but grow closer to Christ and His church. Secondly, The Holy Family strived daily to do the will of God. Mary's Fiat said, "Let it be done unto me according to your word". As for Joseph, his courage and fortitude allowed him to hear the angels' message on multiple occasions to do what was best for his family, not just for himself. Jesus lived a whole life being obedient to his earthly parents while "growing in wisdom and understanding". To His Father in heaven He cried out, "Not my will, but thine be done". Finally, they prayed together as a family and as individuals, alone with the Father. It is crucial that our children see and hear us pray so that they can learn to do the same in their lives and in turn, pass that on into the future lives of their families.
